Dear Judge Mayhew,

You may recall on October 14th, 2020 you denied a petition requesting variance relief from BCZR section 1B02.3.C.1 for 3941 North Point Road. This variance request was to allow an existing, partially constructed dwelling to remain on a lot with a width of 50 feet in lieu of the required 55 feet, with side setbacks of 4 feet and 5 feet in lieu of 10 feet, and a rear setback of 5 feet in lieu of 30 feet. The construction of that dwelling was commenced without first applying for a building permit.

June 27, 2022

In addition, the dwelling that was the subject of your prior hearing was controversial, as it was a large shed-like structure that displaced rain water onto the neighboring lots. You denied the variance requests, finding that the Petitioners failed to meet the first prong of the *Cromwell v. Ward* analysis; that the property was not unique. A copy of your decision is attached for your reference.

That old structure was removed from the property and the lot is now vacant. A new homebuilder is requesting to build a new dwelling on the vacant lot, utilizing section 304 of the BCZR, (Undersized Lot). Under section 304, there is no requirement for "uniqueness" of the property in that all zoning setbacks are being satisfied and no variance relief is being requested.

The purpose of this letter is to seek your verification that a new house can be constructed on this vacant lot. Your prior denial was based on the fact that the property was "not unique". However, since this new house meets all setback requirements and satisfies the 3 prong test under section 304 of the BCZR, uniqueness of the property does not need to be proven.

The zoning office has asked us to request this spirit and intent letter seeking your verification that your previous decision does not preclude a new home from being this new home, given that no variances are needed.

OPINION

This matter comes before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals as an appeal of the ALJ's March 14, 2021 Opinion denying a Petition for Variance filed by R.J. and Susinn Tosato, Legal Owners and Robert Griffin, Contract Purchaser for property located at 3941 North Point Road, requesting variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") § 1802.3.C.1, to allow an existing dwelling to remain (partially constructed, building permits not obtained in advance) on a lot with a lot width of 50 ft. in lieu of the required 55 ft., side setbacks of 4 ft. and 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft. each, and rear setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 30 ft. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a public WebEx hearing was conducted by this Board virtually in lieu of an in-person hearing on March 11, 2021. A public deliberation was held on April 14, 2021. Both the Petitioners and Protestants participated *pro se*.

In the interest of judicial economy, the exhibits previously offered in the hearing before the ALJ were moved into evidence. A site plan was previously marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 11. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment was previously received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS") which indicates that the subject property is located with the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area

("CBCA"). A ZAC comment was also received from the Department of Planning ("DOP"). R.J. Tosato appeared in support of the Petitioners. Robert Zacherl, the President of the Wells and McComas Citizens Improvement Association appeared in opposition and submitted a community petition opposing the requested variance relief.

The subject property is approximately 6,500 square feet and is zoned DR 5.5. A code enforcement citation is pending due to Petitioners conducted extensive construction of a pole barn building on the site without first obtaining permits. Petitioners now seek substantial variance relief for the partially constructed building.

Mr. Tosato testified that when his family purchased the property at issue in 2012 it was zoned ML. Mr. Tosato explained that he was previously informed by the zoning office that he needed to maintain only three-foot setbacks from all property lines. He further testified that he was unaware the property had been rezoned DR 5.5 in 2016 and was unaware of the CZMP process. He noted that there is a road adjacent to the subject property that leads to the property behind it. That property has a commercial use. Mr. Tosato explained his father was building the structure for storage on the bottom level and a residence for himself on the second floor. He stated that his father did not believe a permit was necessary due to the pre-fab nature if the structure. When questioned by the Board, Mr. Tosato was unable to articulate how the lot is unique or distinguishable from other lots on the street.

Mr. Robert Zacherl of the Wells and McComas Citizens Improvement Association testified in opposition to the requested variance relief. Mr. Zacherl explained that the Wells and McComas Citizens Improvement Association had lobbied the District's County Councilman to change the zoning of the subject property during the last CZMP. Mr. Zacherl further explained that the property's present zoning is now in keeping with the other properties on that portion of the street.

Under the BCZR § 307 and Maryland common law, in order to be entitled to variance relief, Petitioners must satisfy a two-step legal analysis, summarized as follows:

It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity is what necessitates the requested variance relief; and If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691,699 (1995).

The general rule is that "the authority to grant a variance should be exercised sparingly and only under exceptional circumstances." *Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore* County, 177 Md. App. 43, 71(2007). This is because "a variance is an authorization for that which is prohibited by a zoning ordinance." *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md. App. 691,699 (1995), and because "citizens [of a given county or municipality] are entitled to strict enforcement of the existing zoning regulations." *Salisbury Bd. Of Zoning Appeals v. Bounds*, 240 Md. 547, 555-56 (1965). Therefore, "[t]he burden is on the applicant to show facts to warrant a variance," and "the specific need for the variance must be substantial and urgent and not merely for the convenience of the applicant." *Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore* County, 177 Md. App. at 70.

By failing to present any evidence regarding the uniqueness of the subject property, the Petitioners failed to meet the first prong of the *Cromwell* analysis. While not necessary, but if the Board where to consider the second prong of the Cromwell analysis, it is clear that any resulting hardship is self-imposed. In the instant case, the hardship arises out of the Petitioner's own disregard of the building permit process. A "self-created" hardship is not a proper justification for granting a variance. *Mueller*, *supra*, *177* Md. App. at 90-91. While the Board is convinced that it was not the Petitioners' intent to conflict with County Zoning law, "mistake" is not an issue for the Board to consider when considering variance relief.

Cromwell v. Ward, supra. Finally, "unless there is a finding that the property is unique, unusual, or different, the process stops here and the variance is denied without any consideration of practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship." Mueller, supra, 177 Md. App. at 70.

At the hearing the undersigned asked the Petitioner directly whether there is anything unique about his property as compared with the surrounding properties. To his credit, Mr. Tosato was forthright in conceding that there is not. The Petitioners have therefore failed to meet the first prong of the legal analysis. Further, even if I were to reach the second prong, the record evidence does not support a finding that Petitioners' need for this variance is "substantial and urgent." In the instant case, the hardship arises out of the Petitioner's own disregard of the building permit process. A "self-created" hardship is not a proper justification for granting a variance. *Mueller, supra,* 177 Md. App. at 90-91. While I am somewhat sympathetic to the financial hardship this denial will cause the Petitioners, the law does not allow me to grant the requested variances. To the contrary, the neighboring property owners are entitled to "strict enforcement of the existing zoning regulations." *Salisbury Bd. Of Zoning Appeals v. Bounds,* 240 Md. 547, 555-56 (1965).

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>14th</u> day of October 2020, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance pursuant to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations § 1B02.3.C.1, to allow an existing dwelling to remain (partially constructed, building permits not obtained in advance) on a lot with a lot width of 50 ft. in lieu of the required 55 ft., side setbacks of 4 ft. and 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft. each, and rear setback of 5 ft. in

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for a Variance from Section 1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations to allow an existing dwelling to remain (partially constructed, building permits not obtained in advance) on a lot width of 50 feet in lieu of the required 55 feet, side setbacks of 4 feet and 5 feet in lieu of the required 10 feet each, and a rear setback of 5 feet in lieu of the required 30 feet.

The property is located along North Point Road between North Point Boulevard and the Beltway. The property is zoned DR 5.5 and is bordered by DR 5.5 zoning to the northwest and northeast, and ML IM zoning to the southwest and southeast.

A code complaint was filed (Record CB2000071) for constructing a large building without permits. Aerial imagery shows that the property has historically been used for storing boats and other vehicles, at least since 2014.

A site visit was conducted on 6/2/2020. A large wood-frame structure has been framed and is under construction. The structure is quite large, 6,500 sq. ft. While there are a number of properties that have garages and barns in the immediate area, they are much smaller and generally behind existing homes. Given the size of the structure and it being the primary building on the lot, the structure is not compatible with the neighborhood.

Given the code complaint, size of the structure, and lack of neighborhood compatibility, the Department of Planning does not recommend approval of the variance request.

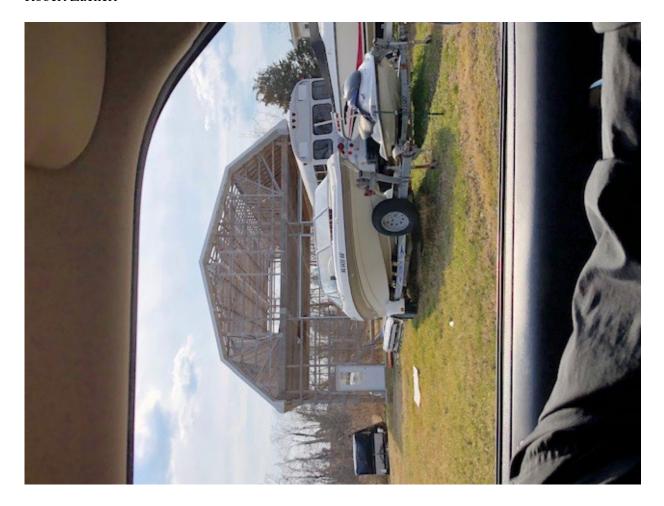

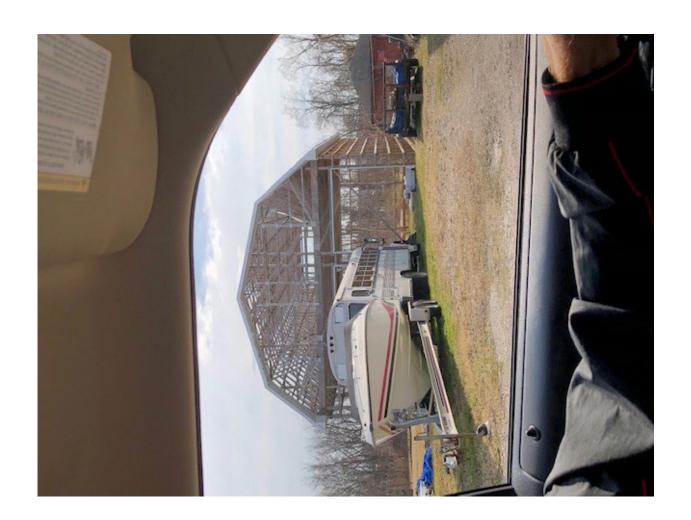

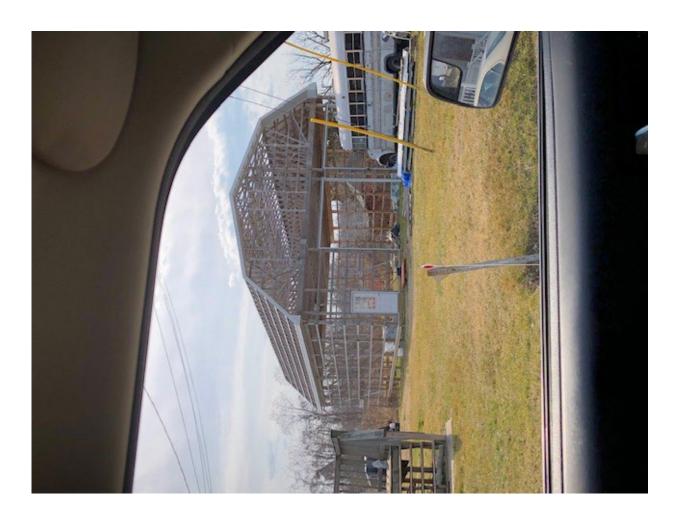

I am Elizabeth Hoeffler. I live at 3939 North Point Rd, next to 3941 North Point rd, which is the address in question for the Case no. 2020-0121-A. Unfortunately, I will not be able to attend the hearing for this case on Tuesday October 13, 2020 at 10:00am. I have a young child, who has learning disabilities, and will be in the middle of virtual learning at the time. I was advised by our community association president, Robert Zacherl, that I should send you an email listing our reasons why we do not want the pole barn variances approved on 3941 North Point rd.

- 1. No permit was obtained from Baltimore county, prior to the frame being erected. My husband Michael Hoeffler spoke to Mr. Tosado the day all the supplies were delivered. He questioned Mr. Tosado if he had a permit, and Mr. Tosado replied "I do not need a permit".
- 2. No setbacks were followed during the build. The setback between our property at 3939 and Mr. Tosado's structure at 3941 is currently 3 feet. Because it is so close, every time it rains, we have water pouring off the roof of the pole barn onto our property. In addition, I do not believe there is enough room for a fire break between our property and this structure.
- 3. Myself, as well as many other neighbors are concerned about our property values being reduced significantly because of this structure.
- 4. From what I understand there is an easement on that property at 3941, that is owned by a business called Fence Fair, which is behind our properties, as well as a field that is also owned by Fence Fair. I have lived at 3939 since 1996. In that time, the field has caught on fire, twice. The fire department accessed the field both times byway of that easement.
- 5. I have been advised by a friend who knows Mr. Tosado, that he is talking about renting out rooms when this pole barn gets done. Consistent with our office's responsibility to defend the comprehensive zoning maps under Baltimore County Charter Sec. 524.1, we have reviewed the record pertinent to this imminent appeal hearing. Based on the documentary and historical facts, we agree with Administrative Law Judge Paul Mayhew's decision that the petition for variances must be denied as a matter of law.

The petition does not meet the relevant standards of uniqueness resulting in practical difficulty under BCZR Sec. 307.1, as explicated in such cases as <u>Cromwell v. Ward</u> 102 Md. App. 691 (1995) and <u>Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel</u> 407 Md. 53 (2008). To begin, the property looks to be fairly average and not unique as relate to potential use. A key point is that the requests for side yard and rear yard variances are extreme. This is due to the disproportionate size, scale, and location of the proposed residence. The rudimentary site plan depicts the structure as occupying 2400 square feet, with five feet or less for the side and rear yard setbacks. The site plan gives no indication of the height, but a photograph shows it to be at least 2 stories. We agree with the Planning Director's June 8, 2020 finding that it is incompatible with the character of the neighborhood, thereby generating adverse impacts.

Unfortunately, the proposed residence was partially constructed prior to proper zoning approval. As ALJ Mayhew says, the premature construction poses a self-created difficulty or hardship. <u>Cromwell</u> is apt on this subject as well. It often happens that initial circumvention of the zoning process involves an excessive and unreasonable use. A petitioner then tries to legitimize the situation after the fact with *post hoc* rationalizations, so as to be rewarded with variances.

Attention should also be paid to the legitimate concerns of the Wells-McComas Citizens Improvement Association and interested neighbors. We note President Robert Zacherl's e-mail, which concludes reasonably,

"We would not have had an issue, had this been a small shed or other out building, but this is a huge structure in square footage as well as height that changes the dynamics of the neighborhood."

Under these circumstances, we submit on the record. We anticipate and expect the material facts elicited at the CBA trial hearing will inevitably corroborate our observations.

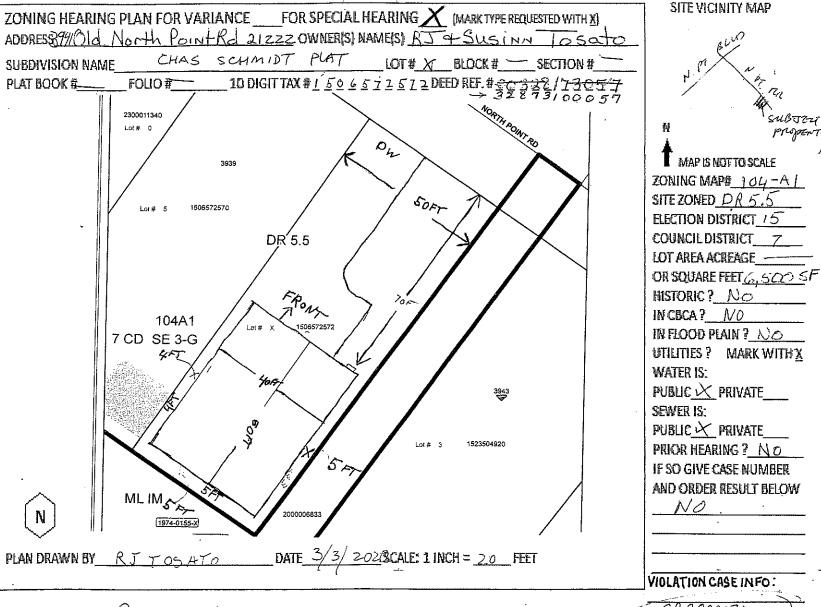






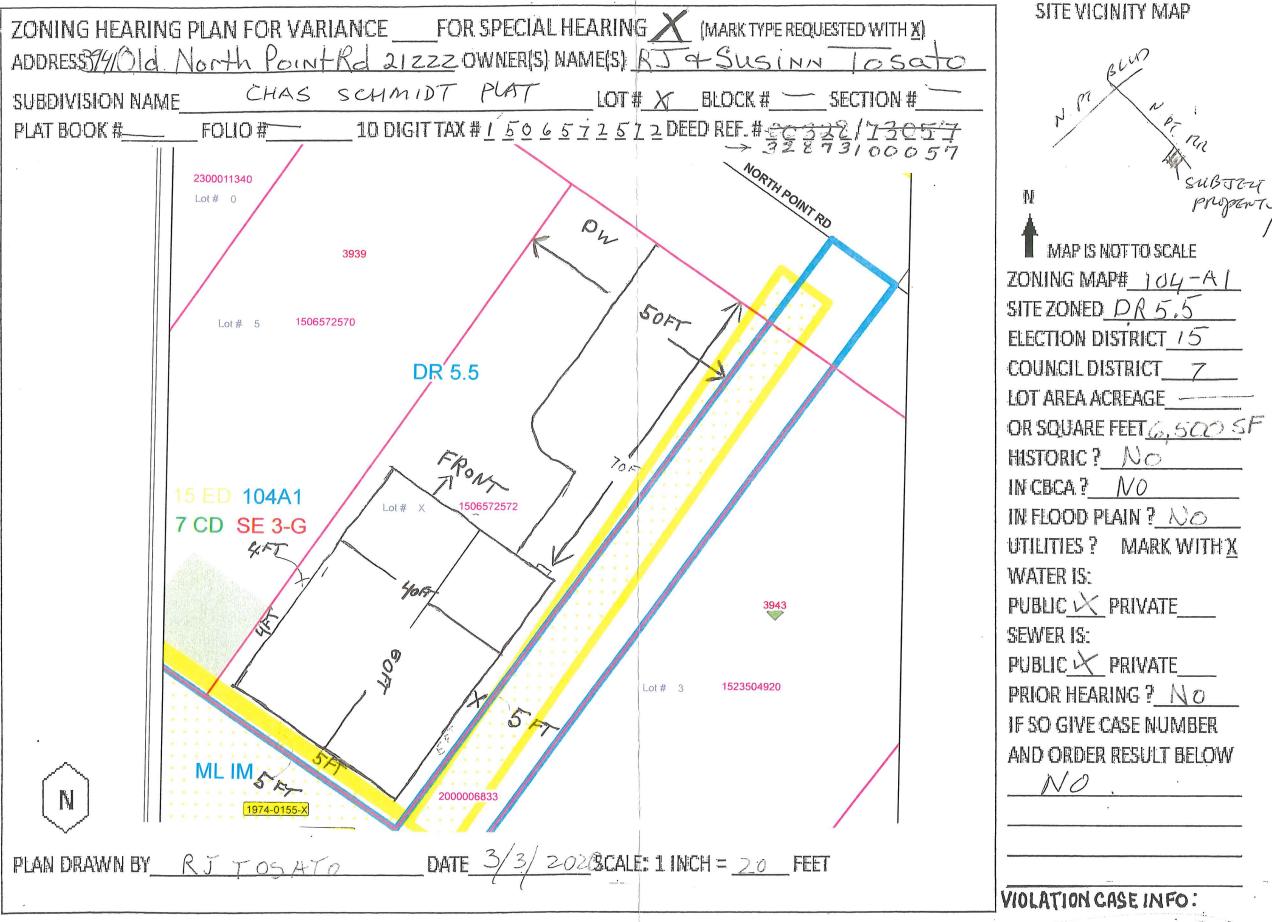






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
