FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals ("Board") as an appeal of the Opinion and Order of Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Paul M. Mayhew, dated January 14, 2021, which granted, with restrictions, a Petition for Special Hearing and a Petition for Variance for a currently unimproved property owned by RCG Revocable Trust (hereinafter "RCG" or "Property Owner"). Specifically, the Petition for Special Hearing is to allow an accessory structure to be located on a lot without a principal structure, and the Petition for Variance is to permit a building height for an accessory structure of 49 feet in lieu of the maximum permitted 15 feet under Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") Section 400.3. The subject unimproved property is immediately adjacent to, and shares a boundary with, a second lot (also owned by RCG) which is improved with a dwelling known as 3466 Butler Road. The appeal of ALJ Mayhew's Opinion and Order was filed by Evelyn L. Cochran, a neighbor. At the requisite public hearing before the Board the Petitioner/Property Owner was represented by Lawrence E. Schmidt, Esquire and the appellant was represented by Michael McCann, Esquire.

Prior to the Board's hearing, the parties advised the Board that they had reached a settlement as to the issues presented. The terms of the settlement reflected an agreement by the

parties that the relief requested should be granted, and that certain conditions governing the future use of the properties owned by RCG and improvements proposed thereon be included in the Board's order. Further, the parties requested, and the Board permitted, that the relevant factual evidence related to this case be presented via a proffer by Mr. Schmidt. A brief summary of those proffered facts is as follows:

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The Petitioner, RCG Revocable Trust, is an entity whose beneficiaries are Rudy C. Gay and Ecko Gay, his wife. Mr. Gay is a Baltimore native and his occupation is that of a professional basketball player. Mr. and Mrs. Gay, through the Trust, have acquired the subject lots with the intention of building their home thereon and residing there, particularly when Mr. Gay's professional career has ended. It is anticipated that the existing house on 3466 Butler Road will be razed and replaced with a new dwelling. On the adjacent unimproved lot, a barn type structure (an accessory building) is proposed.

As noted above, RCG owns two separate lots of record, that are immediately adjacent to one another and share a common boundary. They are shown on Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1 (a site plan) and Petitioner's Exhibit No. 2 (an aerial photograph). The lot with the existing dwelling is 14.26 acres of land in area. The dwelling is accessed via an existing driveway leading from Butler Road. The second lot is 9.903 acres in area and is unimproved. This lot is the subject of the instant zoning requests and is proposed to be improved with a barn type structure. Both lots are zoned RC 2 and are encumbered with Conservation Easements (Petitioner's Exhibits 5A and 5B). These easements limit the uses and extent of the development permitted thereon. These easements also dictate the areas of the properties on which building improvements can be constructed and require that any improvements be clustered within a two acre so as to preserve much of the property as

open space. In fact, much of the overall tract is actively farmed and it is anticipated that these agricultural activities will continue.

Although located on the lot not actually the subject of the zoning petitions at issue, the Gays propose the construction of a new dwelling on the lot which is 14.26 acres. As noted above, the new dwelling will replace an existing house. Access will remain the same; that is, from the driveway which leads into the interior of the property from Butler Road. The appearance/character of this building is of concern to Ms. Cochran, who owns and resides upon an adjacent tract. In fact, her property and home are closer to the proposed dwelling than the proposed barn. In this regard, Mr. Schmidt presented certain documentation (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 11) depicting the contemplated design and appearance of the proposed dwelling. It was described as a "French Country" architectural style and is consistent with the rural nature/theme of the locale. Although recognizing that the final design of the dwelling had not been determined, Mr. Schmidt proffered that the proposed dwelling will be consistent with the exhibit presented. Such a structure is agreeable to Ms. Cochran and language adopting the parties' agreement as to the proposed dwelling will be included as a condition in the Board's order.

Insofar as the second lot owned by the Petitioner, a barn type structure is proposed thereon. This building will not be an agricultural building per se, as it will be used for accessory residential (not commercial) purposes. Given Mr. Gay's career, the barn will contain recreational type amenities, including a basketball court and exercise/gym type area. As set forth in the restrictions attached to the following Order which grants the requested relief, the uses of the barn will be limited to these residential type uses.

The special hearing requested is sought because the barn is on a separate lot from the principal building (i.e. the dwelling) that it serves. By definition, the BCZR require that an

accessory dwelling be located on the same lot as the principal structure that it serves and the special hearing seeks a modification of this requirement. In this regard, it is noted that both lots are owned by the same entity and, as noted above, are both restricted by the terms of the conservation easements recorded for each.

The Petition for Variance requests relief from the height limitation for accessory structures imposed in BCZR Sec. 400.3. This request is driven by multiple factors, including the uniqueness of the property and the nature of the proposed use. As shown on the site plan and photographs submitted (see, specifically, Petitioner's Exhibit No. 8A) the subject lots are physically unique due to a number of factors. These include the existence of a stream, which generates certain environmental constraints including a flood plain and associated buffer. Obviously, pursuant to the County's environmental regulations, no disturbance or construction is permitted in these areas. Moreover, the property features steep slopes, which further limits the building area. Indeed, evidence presented was that the proposed barn will be of a bank barn design; so that it is built into a slope, thereby reducing its visibility. Finally, the terms and conditions of the conservation easements (as well as the desire to continue the agricultural use) further drive the design of the barn structure; mandating that the building be taller than might otherwise be envisioned. Finally, and as will be conditioned below by agreement of the parties, the unusual character of Mr. Gay's occupation and proposed use of the structure mandate the proposed design of the structure. As noted above, it will contain a basketball court and other recreational type amenities. The architectural design and appearance of the barn will be consistent with the proposed dwelling and will match that building's appearance and character. Renderings of the barn are shown on the site plan and that design was acceptable to Ms. Cochran.

Finally, it is to be noted that because the lots are subject to terms of the conservation easements that the proposal was subject to review and approval by the Baltimore County Agricultural Advisory Board. As noted in the Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment from the Department of Planning (Petitioner's Exhibit No. 10), the "Ag Board" approved the location of the barn building at its meeting on August 12, 2020 and the Dept. of Planning does not object to the request. Another ZAC comment, from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"), will also be added as a condition to the relief granted. That comment requires review of the barn construction by the Ground Water Management Division of DPES, given that the barn will have restrooms.

Upon due consideration of the proffered testimony and evidence presented, the Board is persuaded to grant the requested relief. As to the Petition for Special Hearing, we concur with the judgment of the Dept. of Planning as expressed in their ZAC comment; that is, that these lots function "as one under the easement." The purpose of the requirement that accessory structures be on the same lot is served given the proposed location of the buildings and the character of these lots. As to the variance, the Board also finds that the Petitioner has met the criteria of BCZR Sec. 307. The lots are clearly unique, given their environmental and topographical features. Moreover, the terms and requirements of the easement justify the proposed height and layout. Finally, we find the proposed restrictions/conditions as agreed to by the parties to be reasonable and appropriate. Thus, they shall be incorporated in the Board's order.

ORDER

ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing to allow an accessory structure to be located on a lot without a principal structure be and is hereby GRANTED; and it is further,

ORDERED that the Petition for Variance to permit a building height for an accessory structure of 49 feet in lieu of the maximum permitted 15 feet under Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") Section 400.3. be and is hereby GRANTED, all subject to the following restrictions and conditions.

- 1. Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-201 through 7-210 of the *Maryland Rules*.
- 2. The proposed dwelling shall be located as generally shown on the site plan (Exhibits No. 1 and 11). It will generally occupy that portion of the property where the existing dwelling is situated, however, owing to its larger size, may extend to the north, over the existing driveway parking area. This location is subject to minor adjustment as might be necessary in order to comply with any requirements imposed by Baltimore County during the permitting and building approval process. In the event that the Property Owners desire to materially alter the proposed relocation of the house, they shall notify Cochran before they apply for permits.
- The proposed dwelling and barn will be compatible with the rural nature of the locale. The style of the house will be "French Country" and as generally shown on Exhibit No. 10. It is recognized that the final design of the house has not been determined and thus the architectural design and building features may be altered as the project evolves to final design, for so long as those changes do not result in a significantly different and incompatible architectural design.

- 4. The barn (accessory structure) shall be located as shown on site plan (Exhibits No. 1 and 11) and as previously approved by the ALJ and the Agricultural Review Board. This location is subject to adjustment as might be necessary in order to comply with any requirements imposed by Baltimore County during the permitting and building approval process. In the event that the property owners desire to materially alter the proposed location of the barn, they shall notify Cochran before the application for permits.
- 5. The barn shall be used as an accessory structure to a residence. It shall not be used for commercial purposes and shall not be rented. It is anticipated that the barn will contain recreational space and amenities (e.g. a basketball court). These areas shall not be used for organized recreation leagues. Notwithstanding this prohibition, the barn may be used by the property owners, their family and guests for recreational purposes. Also, in recognition of the Property owners' charitable endeavors and practices, the barn may be used to host periodic fundraisers supporting those charitable endeavors.
- 6. Any outdoor or exterior lighting of house or barn shall be cut-off fixture lighting and directed downward, not towards the Cochran property.
- 7. The Property Owners shall not remove or clear existing vegetation and trees along the border of Cochran property except as necessary to prevent personal injury or property damage. Additionally, the Property Owners shall install additional vegetation to provide additional screening. Such vegetation shall include a mix of deciduous and evergreen trees. Such trees shall be of a height and caliper as required in the Baltimore County Landscape Manual for residential screening.

8. The Property Owners shall install such storm water management controls (as approved by Baltimore County) as are necessary to ensure that there is no increase in the volume or rate of flow of storm water shall discharged form the subject property onto the Cochran property.

IN THE MATTER OF: RCG Revocable Trust – Legal Owner 20-229-SPHA

PURPOSE: To deliberate the following:

Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to BCZR § 500.7 to permit an accessory structure on the subject property without a principal structure; and

Petition for Variance filed pursuant to BCZR § 307.1 for relief from BCZR § 400.3 to permit an accessory structure of 49 feet in lieu of the prescribed maximum of 15 feet.

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

- The Board convened for a hearing. Counsel advised that the parties have reached an agreement and provided proffer for the basis of relief and accommodation between the Petitioner and Protestant.
- The Board found there were unique features on the property which limit the area that a structure can be built. As a result, the Petitioner proposes to build the accessory structure into a hill, and the structure will be in the style of a bank barn.
- The Board found there is no problem with building an accessory structure on an adjoining lot that is owned by the same party in an agricultural zone. The Board noted that the proposal makes zoning sense, and has the unintended effect of a zoning merger which would prevent another house from being built on the property. The Board also noted that if a barn were to be built there would be no height restriction.
- Counsel will draft an Order and submit to the Board for review and approval. The Board would like to include a provision that if the accessory structure at some point is converted to an agricultural use, no additional public hearing would be necessary. However, if any other use is proposed, additional public hearing is required.

CONCLUSION: After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to GRANT the requested Petition for Special Hearing and Variance.

NOTE: These minutes, which will become part of the case file, are intended to indicate for the record that a public deliberation took place on the above date regarding this matter. The Board's final decision and the facts and findings thereto will be set out in the written Opinion and Order to be issued by the Board.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of the RCG Revocable Trust, the Legal Owner ("Petitioner"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to permit an accessory structure on the subject property without a principal structure. The Variance request was filed pursuant to BCZR §307.1 for relief from BCZR § 400.3 to permit an accessory structure of 49 feet in lieu of the prescribed maximum of 15 feet.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a public WebEx hearing was conducted virtually in lieu of an in-person hearing. The Petition was properly advertised and posted. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Planning ("DOP") and from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"). They did not oppose the requested relief, subject to proposed conditions, which will be incorporated into the Order.

Ecko and Rudy Gay, appeared in support of the requested relief on behalf of the Trust. They were represented by Neil Lanzi, Esquire of Wright, Constable & Skeen, LLP. Bruce E. Doak, the licensed surveyor who prepared the site plan also appeared; as did Vincent Greene, the licensed

Theaux Le Gardeur, an adjoining property owner appeared in opposition and also submitted a letter of opposition which he read into the record, and which was admitted as Protestant's Exhibit 1. Stephanie Greenberg, one of the other adjoining neighbors, testified in support of the Gays' requested relief. Several other interested persons attended.

PETITIONERS' CASE

The subject property consists of two separate parcels, with separate tax accounts. The Gays' residence is located on one 14.26 acre parcel and the proposed accessory structure is to be located on the other 9,903 acre parcel. Both are zoned RC 2. There are agricultural conservation easements with the Land Preservation Trust and with the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board covering both parcels. (Petitioners' Exhibits 5A and 5B). Mr. Doak testified that he met several times with Wally Lippincott of the DOP to discuss the design and location of the proposed structure. He explained that the proposed site is the only feasible location because of the agricultural easements, the septic field of the principal residence, a flood plain area, and the "harsh topography" of the property. He testified that only a half-acre of the least productive section of crop land will be used. He further explained that the structure will be built into a slope like a traditional bank barn in order to lessen the visual impact on the adjoining properties, which are all relatively distant. Upon questioning from the undersigned, Doak testified that this proposed accessory structure is within the 2 acre envelope of the principal structure (as required by the agricultural easements), because the area delineated picted by the lines surrounding both the residence and this proposed structure on the site plan are a combined 2 acres, and because both structures are served by a common driveway. He stated

by drawing a "lasso" around the residence and the accessory structure. In addition, Doak testified that he obtained approval for the proposed structure from the Baltimore County Agricultural Advisory Board, as required by the conservation easements. This Agricultural Board approval was confirmed by the DOP in its ZAC comment, and the DOP does not oppose the requested relief. Finally, Doak testified that he also reviewed the project with Vicky Collins of the Land Preservation Trust, and with Theresa Moore of the Valleys Planning Council and that they do not oppose the requested relief.

The architect, Vincent Greene, testified next. He explained that the proposed structure is designed to look like a traditional barn and that it will be clad in gray materials simulating barn wood. The floor plans were admitted as Petitioners' Exhibit 6A and 6B, and exterior elevations were admitted as Petitioners' Exhibit 7 A-D, showing all sides of the structure. He explained that the visual impacts of the structure will be lessened by building it into the slope like a bank barn. He noted that the highest point of the structure faces the Gays' residence and will not substantially impact any adjoining property owners. Finally, he explained that the height variance is needed in order to accommodate the basketball court, which is the main function of the structure, and which will be used by Rudy Gay, a professional basketball player, to train in the offseason.

Ms. Gay confirmed that the primary purpose of the proposed structure is for her husband's training needs. The main level will house a weight room in addition to the basketball court. She explained that the structure will also be used for family recreation and as a garage for their vehicles and lawn maintenance equipment. A declaration of intended use was admitted as Petitioner's Exhibit 9. This document will be incorporated into the Order and confirms, among

other things, that the structure will not be used for residential or commercial purposes. ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Date 114/21 By DMynon Finally, as noted above, Stephanie Greenberg testified in support of the Gays. She explained that she and her husband own the adjoining property closest to this proposed structure. She said that they have reviewed the plans and feel that it is a beautiful design that is compatible with the rural nature of the area.

THE OPPOSITION

Mr. Le Gardeur testified that he is opposed to the requested relief for several reasons, which he had previously laid out in a letter that he read into the record. (Protestant's Exhibit 1). He explained that his property lies directly southeast of the subject parcel. He has lived there since 2001. His primary concerns are the height of the structure — which he pointed out is a full 34 feet higher than the normal 15 foot height limit. He also expressed concern about the compatibility of this structure with the Worthington Valley Historical District. He pointed out that this property enjoys the benefits of the conservation easement and in his view the restrictions in the easements should therefore be strictly enforced. Finally, he also expressed concern about the impacts this additional impervious surface would have on McGill Run, a trout stream that runs through the property and then into Western Run, the Gunpowder River, and ultimately, Loch Raven reservoir.

Evelyn Cochran, the adjoining neighbor to the northeast, testified that she is "disturbed" by the proposed height of the structure but otherwise has no objections.

REBUTTAL EVIDENCE

In rebuttal Mr. Doak emphasized that the proposed structure will occupy only a tiny percentage of the crop land, and that this site was chosen in order to have the least possible impact on the agricultural uses of the property. He noted that this type of recreational structure

is expressly permitted under both easements if approved by the County Agricultural Advisory ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Board. He stressed that the petitioners had worked hard with the DOP to obtain their approval, which was based on the fact that the location and design of the structure will be compatible with the RC 2 zone. He again explained that due to the steep topography the proposed site will have very little visual impact on the surrounding neighbors, including Mr. Le Gardeur, whose home is quite distant and entirely screened by a large hill.

Rudy Gay testified that he and his wife purchased this property because of the rural nature of the area, and that they are committed to the agricultural uses imposed by the easements. He explained that this structure will only be used for his training and for other family activities. He further explained that they worked with the architect to design a barn-like structure so that it would blend with the surrounding area.

SPECIAL HEARING

Petitioners require special hearing relief in order to build this "accessory" structure on a lot with no principal structure. I note though that their residence is on the adjoining lot, and would be connected to this accessory structure by a common driveway, so there is a direct nexus between the two structures. There is, however, another wrinkle presented by the conservation easements. Specifically, Section III (B) of the County easement, and Section III (C) of the Land Preservation Trust easement both allow the construction of "necessary structures (for example: garage, well house, tennis court, and swimming pool) designed, constructed and utilized for the purpose of serving the principal residence, so long as such structures are within a two (2) acre Envelope Surrounding the Residence." Id. (emphasis added). As explained above, Mr. Doak testified that the "lasso" approach he used in this site plan allows for this resulting amoeba-like 2 acre building envelope.

This "envelope" is not defined in the easement agreement. However, "building envelope" is defined in the RC 6 regulations as "the area on a lot within which all principal structures except sheds, wells, septic systems, stormwater management systems, driveways or fences are permitted to be built." See, BCZR § 1A07.2. And in the "Development area and standards" regulations in the RC 6, RC 7, and RC 8 zones the "building envelope" is limited to 20,000 square feet. See, BCZR §§1A07.8.B.3, 1A08.6.B.3, 1A09.7.B.3. However, the RC 2 regulations do not define "building envelope" and do not contain the 20,000 sq. ft. limit. In fact, the RC 2 regulations make no mention of "building envelope."

In my view this "lasso" method of determining the 2 acre "envelope" in this case is rather tortured. Mr. Doak acknowledged that, as the crow flies, the site of this proposed accessory structure is significantly more than 2 acres distant from the principal residence. However, neither the DOP nor the Agricultural Advisory Board has objected to the proposed location, or the amoeba-like "envelope" depicted on the site. I will therefore grant the special hearing relief because I find that the proposed barn-like structure is compatible with this rural setting and with the legislative purposed of the RC 2 zone. Further, if this structure were in fact a barn used for agricultural purposes it would not be subject to *any* height restrictions. *See*, BCZR §1A01.3.A, and BCZR § 300.1. In short, there are many structures this high in the RC 2 zones. While I am sympathetic to the neighbors' concerns; because of the bank barn design, the steep topography and the substantial distances separating the adjoining properties, I do not believe the height variance will have a substantial impact. And I note that DEPS did not express any concerns about impacts on water quality, other than requesting a review of the septic proposal for this structure, which will be a condition of the Order. In sum, I find that the special hearing relief

can be granted within the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and without causing harm to the general health, safety, or welfare. 1

VARIANCE

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike (1) surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

As detailed above, the property is unique in several respects. It is divided into two parcels, it is subject to agricultural conservation easements, there is a floodplain area in the middle of the property and the property has "harsh topography" in the form of steep slopes. It is these features that necessitate where the proposed structure must be sited. I find that the petitioners would suffer practical difficulty and hardship if the variance relief were denied because they would be unable to build the proposed structure - which Mr. Gay needs to support his professional career. Petitioners have already invested substantial resources on the architectural design of this structure, which seeks to minimize the impacts on the surrounding properties, and which is aesthetically attractive and compatible. Again, I find that the variance can be granted within the spirit and intent of the BCZR and without harm to the general health, safety and welfare.

¹ The construction and use of the proposed recreational structure on "Parcel 2" as depicted on the site plan will result in a common law merger of the two parcels. See, Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County, 177 Md. App. 43, 94-101 (2007). However, a cursory review of the easements suggests that no further development would be permitted on either parcel regardless of this merger.

- Prior to the issuance of the necessary permits Petitioner shall comply with the DEPS ZAC comments, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

I understand why he feels it is important to disclose as much as possible, but this time they feel it may limit the use of the building. The proposed uses will be testified to in the upcoming hearing. That should be enough for anyone interested.

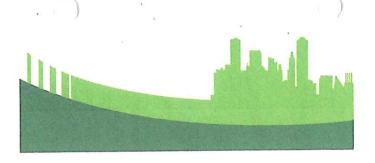

My name is Theaux Le Gardeur, I have resided at 3456 Butler Rd, Reisterstown, MD 21111 since 2001. My property is directly adjacent to the subject property in Special Hearing Case 2020-0229-SPHA

I am concerned that the two petition requests, if approved, will affect my environmental, aesthetic and property interests and assert that my above stated interests will be harmed if approved.

Further, I am unaware of a hardship or burden that the subject property has that would allow for such a special exception and a variance

The proposed structure and the height of the proposed structure on the subject property, collectively hereafter referred to as the "building" is clearly at odds with the following:

Historical Significance: The historical setting of the Worthington Valley Historic District, and the property values of adjacent historical properties may be impacted by the building. Both my residence and outbuilding, along with two other adjacent properties and the subject property, are recognized within the Worthington Valley Historic District, BA-2215 as Caples structures BA-1120, BA-1121, BA-1122, BA-1123 that represent the historically significant agricultural community of Dover that appears on the Baltimore tax map of 1850.

Existing Conservation Easements: The subject property is currently under a conservation easement that may be impacted by the building.

RC-2 Zoning Layer: Under RC-2 zoning without a principle structure the height limit allowable under a nonagricultural use is 15 feet. The proposed height of 49 feet is 14 feet higher than what is allowable even under an agricultural building use for RC-2.

Legardeur by deed dated December 17, 2001 and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland at Liber 15967, folio 688, as to one parcel and by Richard J. Caples by deed dated January 4, 2001 and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland in Liber 14925, folio 577 as to a second parcel,

E. The Grantors desire to convey an agricultural preservation Easement to Baltimore County to restrict the Property to agricultural or open space use in perpetuity, in order to conserve and preserve the significant conservation values including the natural, agricultural, forestry, environmental, scenic, rural, woodland and wetland characteristics of the Property, maintain viable resource-based land use and proper management of tillable and wooded areas of the Property, and, to the extent hereinafter provided, prevent the use or development of the Property for any purpose or in any manner that would conflict with the maintenance of the Property in its open-space condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS DEED OF EASEMENT, WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the sum of Zero Dollars (\$0.00), the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Grantors for the Grantors, their heirs, successors, personal representatives, and assigns, do hereby grant and convey to Grantee as agent for the Grantors, its successors and assigns, an agricultural preservation Easement, in, on, and over the Property, subject to the covenants, conditions, limitations and restrictions herein set forth.

AND the Grantors covenant for the Grantors, their heirs, successors, personal representatives, and assigns, with the Grantee, its successors and assigns to do and refrain from doing upon the Property all and any of the various acts hereafter set forth, it being the intention of the parties that said Property shall be preserved for the agricultural use and open space use as defined in and in accordance with the provisions of the Article XI, Section 14 - 457, of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, and that the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions hereafter set forth are intended to limit the use of the above described land and are deemed to be and shall be construed as covenants running with the land.

II. COVENANTS, CONDITIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND RESTRICTIONS

Subject to the reservations hereinafter contained and except as otherwise provided herein, the Grantors, for the Grantors', their heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns, covenant and agrees as follows:

- A. The Easement shall be in perpetuity. The Grantors hereby specifically waive any rights to terminate under Section 14-462 of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended. The Property shall not be converted to non-agricultural uses unless that use is consistent with maintaining the natural productivity of the land for future agricultural uses.
- B. Other than farming, silviculture, horticulture, noncommercial hunting and fishing for the benefit of the owners and their guests, forestry and other types of agriculture, industrial, commercial recreational, or commercial activities are prohibited on the Property, except for (a) the sale of Agricultural products produced on the Property, for (b) such activities as can be conducted in the residential structure without alteration of the size and external appearance thereof, and for (c) if zoning and other administrative approvals have been obtained in accordance with Article II other

commercial or educational uses that relate to agriculture such as farm markets and farm festivals subject to the approval of Baltimore County.

- "Agriculture" (or "Agricultural" as the context requires) means all methods of production and management of livestock, crops, trees and other vegetation, as well as aquaculture. This includes the related activities of tillage, fertilization, pest control and harvesting as well as the feeding, housing, breeding, training and maintaining of animals such as cows, sheep, goats, hogs, horses and poultry.
- C. The Grantors shall manage the Property in accordance with sound agricultural soil and water conservation practices using a conservation plan that is developed utilizing the standards and specifications of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and approved by the local soil conservation district so as to promote the agricultural capability of the Property.
- D. The Grantors shall implement all soil conservation and water quality practices that are contained within a Soil Conservation Plan (the "Plan") approved by the local soil conservation district, made or revised within the last ten (10) years of the date of the application to sell an Easement, which lists all soil conservation and water quality problem areas on the Property provided no undue financial burden shall be imposed upon the Grantors. The Plan shall be implemented according to the schedule of implementation contained within the Plan that exists within six (6) months of Easement settlement. Revisions to the schedule of implementation may be made as approved by the Board of Supervisors of the local soil conservation district, however, the Plan shall be fully implemented within ten (10) years of the Easement settlement date. Exceptions may be considered by Baltimore County on a case-by-case basis.
- E. The Grantors shall manage woodlots in accordance with sound forestry practices in accordance with a Forest Stewardship Plan approved by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Forest Service that will consider multiple resource objectives and assure protection of soil and water resources.
- F. Signs, billboards or outdoor advertising structures may not be displayed on the Property, except that one sign, not exceeding applicable county zoning regulations, may be displayed to state the name of the Property and the name and address of the occupant, to advertise an activity permitted above, and to advertise the Property for sale or rental.
- G. No dumping of ashes, sawdust, bark, trash, rubbish, or any other material, except that which is for regular agricultural use, shall be permitted on the Property.
- H. No other Easements including, but not limited to, rights-of-ways to other properties, oil, gas, mineral, power line, microwave towers, forest mitigation, or other similar servitudes may be conveyed, or permitted to be established in, on, under or through the above described Property without the Baltimore County's express permission.

- I. In case of doubt concerning the appropriateness or permissibility of the use of the Property, the Grantors may submit a written request to Baltimore County for consideration and approval of the use.
- J. This instrument shall not be deemed to provide for or permit public access to any privately owned land.
- K. The Grantors reserve all other rights, privileges, and incidents to the ownership of the fee simple estate in the above described Property not hereby conveyed or otherwise limited by the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein set forth.
- L. The Grantors hereby grant to the Grantee all remaining development rights that are now or hereafter allocated to, implied, reserved or inherent in the Property. All such granted development rights which may now or hereafter become or represent a transferable density right attributable to the Property are hereby assigned and transferred to Baltimore County and may be sold by it as a participant in any transferable density rights program for use outside of the Agricultural Preservation Areas, as defined in the 2010 Baltimore County Master Plan, as amended, but may not be used or transferred to any portion of the Property as it now or hereafter may be bounded or described, or to any other protected Property adjacent thereto nor used for the purpose of calculating permissible lot yield of the Property.
- M. Nothing in this Article II creates any right in Grantors to engage in any activity or undertake any construction on the Property without complying fully with all laws and administrative requirements related to the activity or construction on the Property, including zoning, subdivision, grading, stormwater management, building and all permitting. If any activity or construction permitted by this Article II is prohibited by any law, or if Grantors do not obtain any administrative approval or permission required to engage in the activity or construction, Grantors may not engage in the activity and the construction may not be undertaken by Grantors. Further, nothing in this Article II constitutes or shall be deemed or implied as constituting approval, authorization or consent by Baltimore County to any activity or construction on the Property, or waives any requirement of law or regulation.

III. SUBDIVISION, CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS

- A. The Grantee acknowledges that there is one existing tenant house on the Property. The tenant house may not be subdivided or conveyed independent of the original parcel and no additional tenant houses are permitted.
- B. The Grantee acknowledges the existence of two main dwelling that exist on the Property. These dwelling may not be subdivided from the Easement. The Grantors may if necessary replace them with new buildings utilizing the same location. The Grantors may modify, enlarge or alter the main dwellings and the tenant house, however, the tenant house shall not exceed 2,500 square feet in total size. If the Grantors wish to replace the dwellings with new houses elsewhere on the Property, the locations are subject to the approval of the Baltimore County.

- C. The Grantors may construct accessory structures designed, constructed and utilized for the purpose of serving the existing residences (for example, garage, well house, tennis court, and swimming pool), within a two (2) acre envelope surrounding the dwellings.
- D. The Grantors may construct, restore, and enlarge accessory and principal structures designed, constructed and utilized for agricultural purposes subject to approval of Baltimore County. Structures shall not be located on Class I, II, or III soils as indicated in the Baltimore County Soil Survey unless no other location is suitable and locating a structure on these soils will not significantly diminish the agricultural resources of the Property. Baltimore County shall have the right to review and reject any proposed location that would have a significant negative impact on the scenic view from Butler and Dover Roads. Baltimore County shall make a final determination of what constitutes "significant negative impact." Baltimore County may not reject any reasonable location and must state its reasons for any rejection in writing to the Grantors.
- E. The total amount of impervious surfaces from all structures shall not exceed ten (10%) percent of the Property pro rated among the four parcels.
- F. The Property shall not be subdivided into more than three (3) parcels of land as described in Exhibit C. No additional subdivision or lot line adjustments are permitted.

IV. RIGHTS, INSPECTION, AND ENFORCEMENT

DEPRM or any other department, agency or other public body or person duly authorized by the County Executive, shall have the right with a minimum 14 day notice to the landowner to enter on the above-described Property from time to time for the sole purpose of inspection and enforcement of the Easements, covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein contained. However, Baltimore County shall not have the right to inspect the interior of any residential dwelling or building designated as a residential dwelling on the Property.

Upon any breach of the terms of this Easement by the Grantors, Baltimore County may exercise any or all of the following remedies:

- institute suits to enjoin any breach or enforce any covenant by ex parte, temporary, and/or permanent injunction either prohibitive or mandatory; and
- require that the Property be restored promptly to the condition required by this Deed of Easement.

Baltimore County's remedies shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to any other rights and remedies available to Baltimore County at law or equity. If the landowner is found to have breached any of the terms under this Easement, the landowner shall reimburse Baltimore County for any costs or expenses incurred by Baltimore County, including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees.

ARTICLE V. EXHIBITS

The following exhibits are hereby made a part of this Easement:

- A. Exhibit A: Boundary Description and Property Reference is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit A consists of six (6) pages.
- B. Exhibit B: Annotated aerial photograph of the Property With Labels is kept on file at the principal office of DEPRM and is fully and completely incorporated into this Easement as though attached hereto and made a part of this Deed of Easement.
- C. Exhibit C: Boundary Description and Property Reference for the three (3) subdivisions are attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit C consists of a plat.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. The Grantee has been appointed herein the agent of the Grantors for the sole purpose of executing and delivering on behalf of the Grantors a contract with Baltimore County to convey a conservation easement on the same terms as set forth herein and pursuant to that contract to execute and deliver a deed of conservation easement on such terms in consideration of the payment of a sum not less than Two Hundred Seventy Eight Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-Five Dollars (\$278,535.00) and upon receipt of such sum to immediately pay over to the Grantors that sum less any expenses the Grantee may incur up to Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). The Grantors agree to indemnify and hold the Grantee harmless from any claims arising out of the contemplated transaction. In the event that settlement with Baltimore County has not occurred on or before March 31, 2003, then the Grantee shall reconvey all interests herein conveyed upon written demand of any of the Grantors.
- B. The Grantors further covenant that the Grantors have not done or suffered to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever, to encumber the Property hereby conveyed; that the Grantors will warrant specially the Property interest hereby conveyed; and the Grantors will execute such further assurances of the same as may be required.
- C. As used herein the singular form of a word includes both the singular and plural, the plural form of a word includes both plural and singular, and reference the words of certain gender includes reference to all genders.
- D. No determination by any court, governmental body, or otherwise that any provision of this Deed of Easement is invalid or unenforceable in any instance shall affect the validity or enforceability of (a) any other such provision or (b) such provision in any circumstance not controlled by such determination. Each such provision shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent allowed by, and shall be construed wherever possible as being consistent with, applicable law.

- E. The Grantors shall notify Baltimore County in writing of the names and addresses of any party to whom the Property, or any part thereof, is to be granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred at or prior to the time said transfer is consummated. The Grantors further agree to make specific reference to this Easement in a separate paragraph of any subsequent deed or other legal instrument by which any interest in the Property is granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred. The Grantors shall provide a copy of this Easement to all subsequent Grantors of the fee simple interest of any part or all of this Property.
- F. In the event that any applicable State or federal law imposes affirmative obligations on owners of land which, if complied with by the Grantors would be a violation of a term of this Easement, the Grantors shall: (i) if said law requires a specific act without any discretion on the part of the Grantors, comply with said law and give Baltimore County written notice of the Grantors' compliance as soon as reasonably possible, but in no event more than thirty (30) days from the time the Grantors begin to comply; or (ii) if said law leaves to the Grantors' discretion how to comply with said law, use the method most protective of the agricultural values [conservation values see Exhibit] of the Property.
- G. Any notices by the Grantors to Baltimore County pursuant to any term hereof shall be sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to: Baltimore County, Maryland, Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management, 401 Bosley Avenue, Towson, MD 21204 and to such other address as the Baltimore County may establish in writing on notification to the Grantors.
- H. In any case where the terms of this Easement require the approval of Baltimore County, such approval shall be requested by written notice to Baltimore County. Such approval shall be deemed to have been given unless within sixty (60) days after receipt of notice Baltimore County mails notice to the Grantors of disapproval and the reason. Baltimore County will take into account the terms and purposes of this Deed of Easement in determining whether to give such approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld but its decision shall be final and in its sole and absolute discretion.
- I. The Grantee agrees to hold this Easement exclusively for conservation purposes, as defined in Section 170(h)(4)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- J. The Grantors and the Grantee agree that all mortgages and deeds of trust affecting the Property are subordinate to the rights of the Grantee under this Easement. The Grantors have provided a copy of this Deed of Easement to all mortgagees, and trustees and beneficiaries of deeds of trust affecting the Property as of the date of this Easement, and each mortgagee, trustee and beneficiary has subordinated the mortgage or deed of trust to this Easement, by signing a subordination agreement which shall be recorded in the Land Records at the time of recording of the conveyance by the Grantee to Baltimore County.
- K. This Deed of Easement shall be construed pursuant to the purposes set forth herein and the law of the State of Maryland, including the purposes of the statutes creating and governing the

Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, and the purposes of Section 2-118 of the Real Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

- The terms of this Deed of Easement shall be in addition to any local, State or federal laws imposing restrictions to the Property and any real estate interests imposing restrictions to the Property.
- This instrument sets forth the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the Easement and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings or agreements relating to the Deed of Easement. If any term is found to be invalid, the remainder of the terms of this Deed of Easement, and the application of such term to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is found to be invalid, shall not be affected thereby.
- The terms "Grantor" and "Grantee" wherever used herein, and any pronouns used in place thereof, shall include, respectively, the above-named Grantor and heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns and the above-named Grantee and its successors and assigns.
- The Grantee shall record this Deed of Easement in a timely fashion among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland, and the Grantee may re-record it at any time as may be required to preserve its rights hereunder.
- Except to the extent provided for by State or local law, nothing herein contained shall relieve the Grantor of the obligation to pay taxes in connection with the ownership or transfer of the Property.

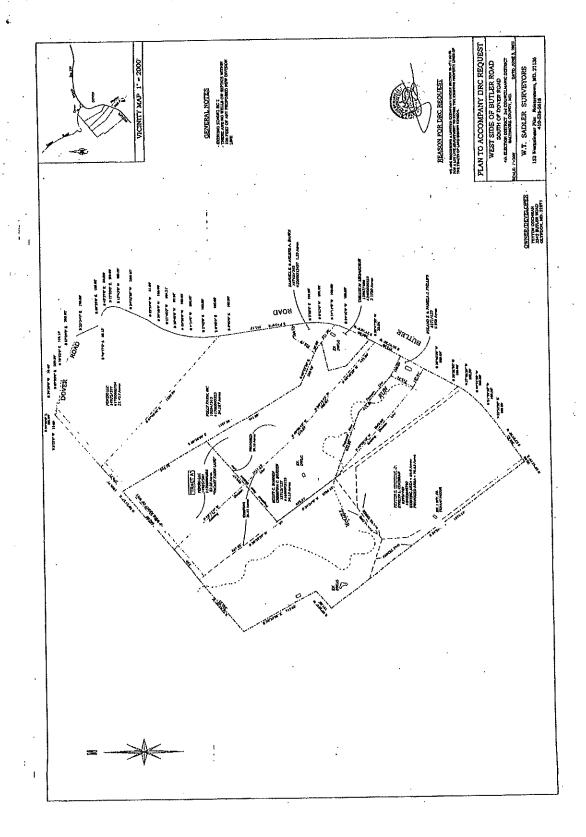

of ______, by and among SCOTT CAMERON BORDEN and CHRISTINA CROMWELL BORDEN, husband and wife, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantor,") and BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND, a body corporate and politic, to the use of the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (hereinafter referred to as "DEPRM") on behalf of the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee.")

I. RECITALS

- A. Article XI, Section 14-457, of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, created the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Program to preserve productive agricultural land; and
- B. By authority of the Agricultural Land Preservation Article, Section 14-458, Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, the Grantee may purchase development rights or may accept the donation of development rights to restrict land to agricultural or open space use; and
- C. The Grantor owns in fee simple 24.169 acres of certain real property (the "Property") situate, lying and being in the Fourth Election District of Baltimore County, Maryland, and more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which was conveyed by Deed dated:
- D. The Grantor desires to convey an agricultural preservation Easement to the Grantee to restrict the Property to agricultural or open space use in perpetuity, in order to conserve and preserve the significant conservation values including the natural, agricultural, forestry, environmental, scenic, rural, woodland and wetland characteristics of the Property, maintain viable resource-based land use and proper management of tillable and wooded areas of the Property, and, to the extent hereinafter provided, prevent the use or development of the Property for any purpose or in any manner that would conflict with the maintenance of the Property in its open-space condition.

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS DEED OF CONSERVATION EASEMENT, WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy-two Thousand, Three Hundred Eighty-six and 16/100 Dollars (\$72,386.16), which equals \$ 2,995.00 per acre, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Grantor for the Grantor, its successors and assigns, do hereby grant and convey to Baltimore County, Maryland, as Grantee, its successors and assigns, an agricultural preservation Easement, in, on, and over the Property, subject to the covenants, conditions, limitations and restrictions herein set forth.

AND the Grantor covenants for the Grantor, its successors and assigns, with the Grantee, its successors and assigns to do and refrain from doing upon the Property all and any of the various acts hereafter set forth, it being the intention of the parties that said Property shall be preserved for the agricultural use and open space use as defined in and in accordance with the provisions of the Article XI, Section 14-457, of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, and that the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions hereafter set forth are intended to limit the use of the above described land and are deemed to be and shall be construed as covenants running with the land.

II. COVENANTS, CONDITIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND RESTRICTIONS

Subject to the reservations hereinafter contained and except as otherwise provided herein, the Grantor, for the Grantor's successors and assigns, covenants and agrees as follows:

- A. This Easement shall be in perpetuity. The Grantor hereby specifically waives any rights to terminate under Section 14-462 of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended. The Property shall not be converted to non-agricultural uses unless that use is consistent with maintaining the natural productivity of the land for future agricultural uses.
- B. Other than farming, silviculture, horticulture, noncommercial hunting and fishing for the benefit of the owners and their guests, forestry and other types of agriculture, industrial, commercial recreational, or commercial activities are prohibited on the Property, except for (a) the sale of Agricultural products produced on the Property, for (b) such activities as can be conducted in the residential structure without alteration of the size and external appearance thereof, and for (c) if zoning and other administrative approvals have been obtained in accordance with Article II.O other commercial or educational uses that relate to agriculture such as farm markets and farm festivals subject to the approval of the Grantee.

"Agriculture" (or "Agricultural" as the context requires) means all methods of production and management of livestock, crops, trees and other vegetation, as well as aquaculture. This includes the related activities of tillage, fertilization, pest control and harvesting as well as the feeding, housing, breeding, training and maintaining of animals such as cows, sheep, goats, hogs, horses and poultry.

- C. The Grantor shall manage the Property in accordance with sound agricultural soil and water conservation practices using a conservation plan that is developed utilizing the standards and specifications of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and approved by the local soil conservation district so as to promote the agricultural capability of the Property.
- D. The Grantor shall implement all soil conservation and water quality practices that are contained within a Soil Conservation Plan (the "Plan") approved by the local soil conservation district, made or revised within the last ten (10) years of the date of the application to sell an Easement, which lists all soil conservation and water quality problem areas on the Property provided no undue financial burden shall be imposed upon the Grantor. The Plan shall be implemented according to the schedule of implementation contained within the Plan that exists within six (6) months of Easement settlement. Revisions to the schedule of implementation may be made as approved by the Board of Supervisors of the local soil conservation district, however, the Plan shall be fully implemented within ten (10) years of the Easement settlement date. Exceptions may be considered by the Grantee on a case-by-case basis.

- E. The Grantor shall manage woodlots in accordance with sound forestry practices in accordance with a Forest Stewardship Plan approved by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Forest Service that will consider multiple resource objectives and assure protection of soil and water resources.
- F. Signs, billboards or outdoor advertising structures may not be displayed on the Property, except that one sign, not exceeding applicable county zoning regulations, may be displayed to state the name of the Property and the name and address of the occupant, to advertise an activity permitted above, and to advertise the Property for sale or rental.
- G. No dumping of ashes, sawdust, bark, trash, rubbish, or any other material, except that which is for regular agricultural use, shall be permitted on the Property.
- H. No other Easements including, but not limited to, rights-of-ways to other properties, oil, gas, mineral, power line, microwave towers, forest mitigation, or other similar servitudes may be conveyed, or permitted to be established in, on, under or through the above described Property without the Grantee's express permission.
- I. In case of doubt concerning the appropriateness or permissibility of the use of the Property, the Grantor may submit a written request to the Grantee for consideration and approval of the use.
- J. This instrument shall not be deemed to provide for or permit public access to any privately owned land.
- K. The Grantor reserves all other rights, privileges, and incidents to the ownership of the fee simple estate in the above described Property not hereby conveyed or otherwise limited by the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein set forth.
- L. The Grantor hereby grants to the Grantee all remaining development rights that are now or hereafter allocated to, implied, reserved or inherent in the Property. All such granted development rights which may now or hereafter become or represent a transferable density right attributable to the Property are hereby assigned and transferred to the County and may be sold by it as a participant in any transferable density rights program for use outside of the Agricultural Preservation Areas, as defined in the 2010 Baltimore County Master Plan, as amended, but may not be used or transferred to any portion of the Property as it now or hereafter may be bounded or described, or to any other protected Property adjacent thereto nor used for the purpose of calculating permissible lot yield of the Property.
- M. Nothing in this Article II creates any right in Grantor to engage in any activity or undertake any construction on the Property without complying fully with all laws and administrative requirements related to the activity or construction on the Property, including zoning, subdivision, grading, stormwater management, building and all permitting. If any activity or construction permitted by this Article II is prohibited by any law, or if Grantor does not obtain any administrative approval or permission required to engage in the activity or construction, Grantor may not engage in the activity and the construction may not be undertaken by Grantor. Further, nothing in this Article II constitutes or shall be deemed or implied as constituting approval, authorization or consent by Grantee to any activity or construction on the Property, or waives any requirement of law or regulation.

III. SUBDIVISION, CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS

The property consists of two parcels as described in Exhibit A, said parcels shall remain in common ownership. However Grantee may approve the division of the Property and separate ownership of the Property for reasons that Grantee determines, in its sole discretion were sufficiently extraordinary to justify an exception to the prohibition.

The total number of residential structures (including for example, but not limited to principal residences, guest houses, tenant houses, farm manager houses, condominiums, apartments, mobile homes, seasonal cabins shall not exceed one (1). No building, facility, means of access or other structures shall be constructed on the Property after the date of this Conservation Easement except:

- A. To modify, enlarge or alter the principal residence. If the Grantor wishes to replace the dwelling with a new house elsewhere on the Property, the location is subject to the approval of the Grantee. The Grantor may, if necessary replace the building with a new building utilizing the same location.
- B. To construct necessary structures (for example: garage, well house, tennis court, and swimming pool) designed, constructed and utilized for the purpose of serving the principal residence, so long as such structures are within a two (2) acre Envelope Surrounding the Residence. The boundary of the Envelope Surrounding the Residence shall be submitted by the Grantor to the Grantee at the time of a proposal to construct an accessory structure. The Grantee shall review the location to assure that the impact to the agricultural resources shall be minimized. Once a location is approved it shall not be altered except in the sole discretion of the Grantee.
- C. To construct, restore, and enlarge accessory and princpal structures designed, constructed and utilized for agricultural purposes subject to the approval of the Grantee. Structures shall not be located on Class I, II, or III soils as indicated in the Baltimore County Soil Survey unless no other location is suitable and locating a structure on these soils will not significantly diminish the agricultural resources of the Property. The Grantee shall have the right to review and reject any proposed location that would have a significant negative impact on the scenic view from Butler and Dover Roads. The Grantee shall make a final determination of what constitutes "significant negative impact," however, the Grantee may not reject any reasonable location and must state its reasons for any rejection in writing to the Grantor.
- D. The total amount of impervious surfaces from all structures shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of The Property.
- E. To replace, improve, repair, restore, alter, remodel, and maintain all existing structures and other structures permitted under this Conservation Easement consistent with paragraphs A, B, and C a above.
- E. To replace, improve, repair, restore, alter, remodel, and maintain all existing structures and other Structures permitted under this Conservation Easement consistent with paragraphs A, B, and C Above.
- F. To construct and maintain reasonable means of access to all permitted uses and structures on the Property.

IV. RIGHTS, INSPECTION, AND ENFORCEMENT

DEPRM or any other department, agency or other public body or person duly authorized by the County Executive, shall have the right with a minimum 14 day notice to the landowner to enter on the above-described Property from time to time for the sole purpose of inspection and enforcement of the Easements, covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein contained. However, the Grantee shall not have the right to inspect the interior of any residential dwelling or building designated as a residential dwelling on the Property.

Upon any breach of the terms of this Easement by the Grantor, the Grantee may, exercise any or all of the following remedies:

- 1. institute suits to enjoin any breach or enforce any covenant by ex parte, temporary, and/or permanent injunction either prohibitive or mandatory; and
- require that the Property be restored promptly to the condition required by this Deed of Easement.

The Grantee's remedies shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to any other rights and remedies available to the Grantee at law or equity. If the Grantor are found to have breached any of the terms under this Easement, the Grantor shall reimburse the Grantee for any costs or expenses incurred by the Grantee, including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees.

ARTICLE V. EXHIBITS

The following exhibits are hereby made a part of this Easement:

- A. Exhibit A: Boundary Description and Property Reference is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit "A" consists of three (3) pages.
- B. <u>Exhibit "B": Annotated aerial photograph of the Property With Labels is kept on file at</u> the principal office of DEPRM and is fully and completely incorporated into this Easement as though attached hereto and made a part of this Deed of Conservation Easement.
- C. Exhibit "C": Conservation Values are attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit "C" consists of one (1) page.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. The Grantor further covenants that the Grantor has not done or suffered to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever, to encumber the Property hereby conveyed; that the Grantor will warrant specially the Property interest hereby conveyed; and the Grantor will execute such further assurances of the same as may be required.
- B. As used herein the singular form of a word includes both the singular and plural, the plural form of a word includes both plural and singular, and reference the words of certain gender includes reference to all genders.

- C. No determination by any court, governmental body, or otherwise that any provision of this Deed of Conservation Easement is invalid or unenforceable in any instance shall affect the validity or enforceability of (a) any other such provision or (b) such provision in any circumstance not controlled by such determination. Each such provision shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent allowed by, and shall be construed wherever possible as being consistent with, applicable law.
- D. The Grantor shall notify the Grantee in writing of the names and addresses of any party to whom the Property, or any part thereof, is to be granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred at or prior to the time said transfer is consummated. The Grantor further agrees to make specific reference to this Easement in a separate paragraph of any subsequent deed or other legal instrument by which any interest in the Property is granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred. The Grantor shall provide a copy of this Easement to all subsequent Grantors of the fee simple interest of any part or all of this Property.
- E. In the event that any applicable State or federal law imposes affirmative obligations on owners of land which, if complied with by the Grantor would be a violation of a term of this Easement, the Grantor shall: (i) if said law requires a specific act without any discretion on the part of the Grantor, comply with said law and give the Grantee written notice of the Grantor's compliance as soon as reasonably possible, but in no event more than thirty (30) days from the time the Grantor begins to comply; or (ii) if said law leaves to the Grantor's discretion how to comply with said law, use the method most protective of the agricultural values [conservation values (see Exhibit) of the Property.
- F. Any notices by the Grantor to the Grantee pursuant to any term hereof shall be sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to: Baltimore County, Maryland, Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management, 401 Bosley Avenue, Towson, MD 21204 and to such other address as the Grantee may establish in writing on notification to the Grantor.
- G. In any case where the terms of this Easement require the approval of the Grantee, such approval shall be requested by written notice to the Grantee. Such approval shall be deemed to have been given unless within sixty (60) days after receipt of notice the Grantee mail notice to the Grantor of disapproval and the reason. The Grantee will take into account the terms and purposes of this Deed of Conservation Easement in determining whether to give such approval, but its decision shall be final and in its sole and absolute discretion.
- H. The Grantee agrees to hold this Easement exclusively for conservation purposes, as defined in Section 170(h)(4)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- I. The Grantor and the Grantee agree that all mortgages and deeds of trust affecting the Property are subordinate to the rights of the Grantee under this Easement. The Grantor has provided a copy of this Deed of Conservation Easement to all mortgagees, and trustees and beneficiaries of deeds of trust affecting the Property as of the date of this Easement, and each mortgagee, trustee and beneficiary has subordinated the mortgage or deed of trust to this Easement, by signing a subordination agreement which shall be recorded in the Land Records at the time of recording of this Deed of Conservation Easement.

- J. This Deed of Conservation Easement shall be construed pursuant to the purposes set forth herein and the law of the State of Maryland, including the purposes of the statutes creating and governing the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, and the purposes of Section 2-118 of the Real Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- K. The terms of this Deed of Easement shall be in addition to any local, State or federal laws imposing restrictions to the Property and any real estate interests imposing restrictions to the Property.
- This instrument sets forth the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the Easement and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings or agreements relating to the Deed of Conservation Easement. If any term is found to be invalid, the remainder of the terms of this Deed of Conservation Easement, and the application of such term to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is found to be invalid, shall not be affected thereby.
- M. The terms "Grantor" and "Grantee" wherever used herein, and any pronouns used in place thereof, shall include, respectively, the above-named Grantor, its successors, and assigns and the above-named Grantee and its successors and assigns.
- N. The Grantee shall record this Deed of Conservation Easement in a timely fashion among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland, and the Grantee may re-record it at any time as may be required to preserve its rights hereunder.
- O. Except to the extent provided for by State or local law, nothing herein contained shall relieve the Grantor of the obligation to pay taxes in connection with the ownership or transfer of the Property.

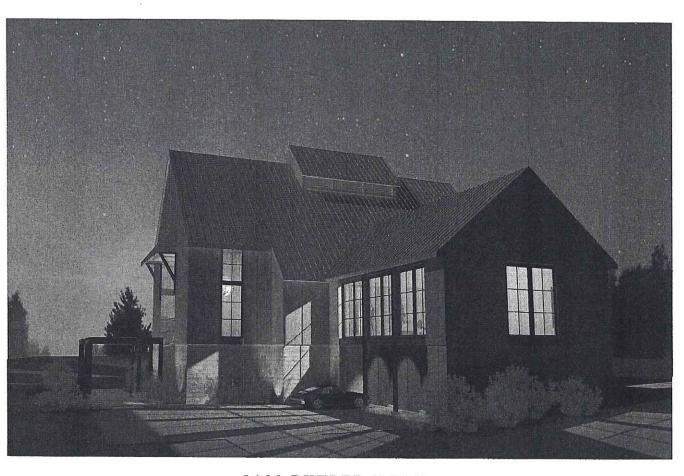

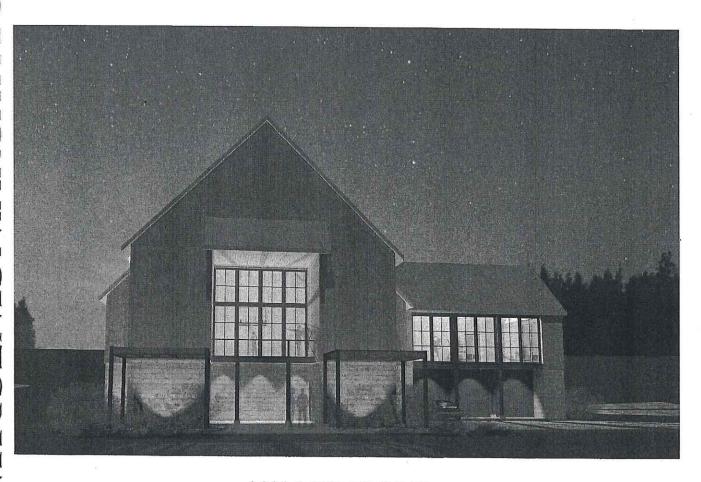

Mr. Perlow and Hearing Officers,

My name is Theaux Le Gardeur; I have resided at 3456 Butler Rd, Reisterstown, MD 21111 since 2001. My property is directly adjacent to the subject property in Special Hearing Case 2020-0229-SPHA

I am concerned that the two petition requests, if approved, will affect my environmental, aesthetic and property interests and assert that my above stated interests will be harmed if approved.

Further, I am unaware of a hardship or burden that the subject property has that would allow for such a special exception and/or a variance.

The proposed structure and the height of the proposed structure on the subject property, collectively hereafter referred to as the "building" is clearly at odds with the following:

Historical Significance: The historical setting of the Worthington Valley Historic District, and the property values of adjacent historical properties may be impacted by the building. Both my residence and outbuilding, along with two other adjacent properties and the subject property, are recognized within the Worthington Valley Historic District, BA-2215 as Caples structures BA-1120, BA-1121, BA-1122, BA-1123 that represent the historically significant agricultural community of Dover that appears on the Baltimore tax map of 1850.

Existing Conservation Easements: The subject property is currently under a conservation easement that may be impacted by the building.

RC-2 Zoning Layer: Under RC-2 zoning without a principle structure the height limit allowable under a nonagricultural use is 15 feet. The proposed height of 49 feet is 14 feet higher than what is allowable even under an agricultural building use for RC-2 and 34 feet higher than what is allowed under RC-2 zoning of the subject property not under an agricultural building use.

Water Quality impacts: The additional impervious surface associated with the building may adversely impact McGill Run, a designated USE III-P (wild trout water, drinking

water supply) stream that, at its confluence with Piney Run at the Mantua Mill Rd Bridge forms the Western Run, then joins the Gunpowder River that empties into Loch Raven which provides drinking water for 1.5 million Baltimore Metro area residents.

Visual impacts to Horses and Hounds Scenic Byway: The subject property and proposed building is bounded by Butler Rd. and within view of Dover Rd, both parts of the Horse and Hounds Scenic Byway and may impact the view-shed.

For all of the above reasons, I respectfully request that the two petition requests are denied. Please confirm that this letter has been placed in the file prior to the hearing and thank you in advance for your assistance.
