OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of White Marsh Plaza Business Trust, Legal Owner ("Petitioner") for property located at 7900-7990 Honeygo Blvd., White Marsh. The Special Hearing requests an amendment to the Order and Site Plan approved in Case No. 2013-0206-A. In addition, Petitioner requests a Variance from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") §409.6 to allow a total of 381 off-street surface parking spaces in lieu of the required 516 parking spaces.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a public WebEx hearing was conducted virtually in lieu of an in-person hearing. The Petition was properly advertised and posted. Andy Bottero, Senior Director of Development and Kathleen Zachmeier-McLaren, Regional Property Manager, both appeared on behalf of Federal Realty Investment Trust (a/k/a FR White Marsh, Inc.), the sole trustee of White Marsh Plaza Business Trust in support of the requested relief. Christopher W. Armstrong, PE (Dev. Ex. 2) who prepared and sealed a site plan in support of the Petitions (the "Site Plan") (Dev. Ex. 1) and J. Mark Keeley, PTP with Traffic Concepts, Inc. (Dev. Ex. 5) also appeared. David H. Karceski, Esquire and C. Andrew Robinson, Esquire and Venable, LLP represented the Petitioner. There were no protestants or interested persons in attendance.

Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Planning ("DOP") dated December 9, 2020 and from Department of Environment and Sustainability and Protection ("DEPS") dated October 29, 2020. Those agencies did not oppose the requested relief.

FACTS AND EVIDENCE

The case proceeded by way of modified proffer from Mr. Karceski and Mr. Keeley. The Property is 7.2 +/- acres and is zoned business-major, commercial town center (BM-CT). The Property is improved with a strip shopping center included a Giant food store, constructed in the 1980s, which anchors the center. The Property is contiguous to, but not part of, the White Marsh Mall. It is bound on west by Perry Hall Blvd. and on the south by Honeygo Blvd. The northern and eastern sides are bound by access roads which flow into the White Marsh Mall.

Aerial photographs provide an accurate depiction of the Property which is elbow shaped and is different from other properties in the surrounding area. (Pet. Ex. 3). In addition, street view photographs of various aspects of the Property, including the parking lot, offer a detailed perspective of a well-maintained site. (Pet. Ex. 4).

In 2013, a parking variance was granted for 387 spaces in lieu of 475 required spaces for commercial tenants including restaurants (Case No.: 2013-0206-A). The 2013 site plan shows the existing tenants in the shopping center at that time. (Dev. Ex. 7). In 2011, a sign variance was granted for the Giant. (Case No.: 2011-0041-A).

Mr. Keeley testified in regard to his parking analysis which referenced the Institute of Transportation Engineers Parking Generation Manual 5th Edition ("ITE Manual") to obtain the peak hour parking demand for standalone uses and for a shopping center. Mr. Keeley also factored in the parking counts he conducted in April of 2013 and again in January, 2021. (Dev. Ex. 6).

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Based on this information, he opined that the Property has an adequate parking supply with 381 spaces to support the center. (Dev. Ex. 6).

DECISION

Petitioner in this case seeks a parking variance of 381 off-street surface parking spaces in lieu of the required 516 parking spaces under BCZR, §409.6, which is necessitated by a change in tenants (new retail tenants (including restaurants) for the center. These new tenants require a different parking calculation than that in the 2013 Site Plan. (Dev. Ex. 7).

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995). In both Case No.: 2013-0206-A and Case No.: 2011-0041-A, the Property was found to be unique. Given that the Property has not changed in terms of its irregular physical characteristics and is still 'elbow-shaped', I find that the prior findings of uniqueness apply here.

If the B.C.Z.R. were strictly enforced, the Petitioner would indeed suffer a practical difficulty, given it would be unable to attract commercial tenants for its center. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of community opposition. In addition, a parking study was completed by Traffic Concepts, Inc. (Pet. Ex. 6) demonstrating that more than sufficient parking exists on Property. Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition,

and for the reasons set forth above, the variance relief requested shall be granted.

ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 8th day of February 2021, by this Administrative Law Judge that the Petition for Special Hearing for an amendment to the Order and Site Plan approved in zoning Case No. 2013-0206-A is GRANTED; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that the Variance pursuant to from BCZR, §409.6 to allow a total of 381 off-street surface parking spaces in lieu of the required 516 parking spaces is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this

Order.

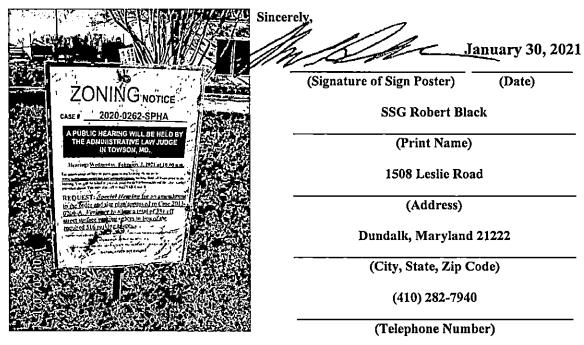

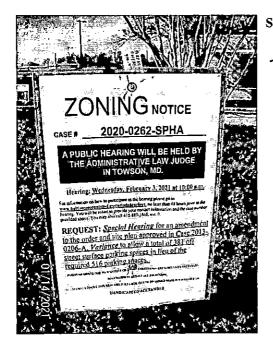

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for a Special Hearing pursuant to Section 500.7 of the BCZR to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve an amendment to the order and site plan approved in Zoning Case No 2013-206, and for a Variance from Section 409.6 of the BCZR to allow a total of 381 off street surface parking spaces in lieu of the required 516 spaces.

A site visit was conducted on 12/1/2020. The subject site is a small strip shopping center located in the White Marsh Town Center. The site is anchored by a Giant Food store and was constructed in the early 1980's directly adjacent to White Marsh Mall.

The request for determination of an amended site plan and for a parking variance is necessitated by a change in tenants for the center. A standard restaurant is proposed for the center, replacing a retail tenant, and requiring a different parking calculation than that in the most recent site plan from 2013.

The Department of Planning has reviewed this request and the associated site plan and has no objections to the requests.

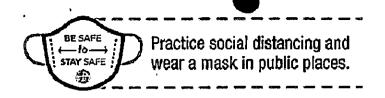

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance filed by David H. Karceski, Esquire, on behalf of the legal owner of the subject property. The Petitioner is requesting Variance relief from Section 409.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to allow 387 off-street parking spaces in lieu of the required 475 parking spaces. The subject property and requested relief is more fully depicted on the site plan that was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests were Mark Keeley, Brian Donley and Joseph Ucciferro. David H. Karceski, Esquire with Venable, LLP appeared and represented the Petitioner. The file reveals that the Petition was properly advertised and the site was properly posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

The only substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comment was received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) dated March 15, 2013, indicating that the variance, if granted, should be conditioned on the site being landscaped in accordance with the approved landscape plan.

ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Bv.

Testimony and evidence revealed that the subject property is approximately 7.2 acres and is zoned BM-CT. The site is improved with a shopping center contiguous to, but not part of, the White Marsh Mall. Petitioner is seeking to lease space to new commercial tenants (including restaurants) and to do so requires variance relief.

Based upon the testimony and evidence presented, I will grant the request for variance relief. Under *Cromwell* and its progeny, to obtain variance relief requires a showing that:

(1) The property is unique; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel, 407 Md. 53, 80 (2008).

Petitioner has met this test. The site is irregularly shaped (counsel describes it as elbow shaped) and the property is surrounded by roadways. Thus, it is unique.

If the B.C.Z.R. were strictly enforced, the Petitioner would indeed suffer a practical difficulty, given it would be unable to attract commercial tenants for its center. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of county and/or community opposition. In addition, a parking study was completed by Traffic Concepts, Inc. (Exhibit 5) demonstrating that more than sufficient parking exists on site.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition, and for the reasons set forth above, the variance relief requested shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this 29th day of April, 2013, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance seeking relief pursuant to Section 409.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to allow 387 off-street parking spaces in ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

lieu of the required 475 parking spaces, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- 1. Petitioner may apply for appropriate permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioner, consistent with the ZAC comment received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review dated March 15, 2013, shall meet with the County's landscape architect to determine and complete whatever plantings are necessary to bring the site into compliance with the existing, approved landscape plan.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the Petitioner, Giant of Maryland, LLC through one of its senior managers of construction, Juan Carlos Vivas, and their attorney, Charles B. Marek, III, Esquire of Gildea and Schmidt, LLC. The Petition was also signed by the property owner, White Marsh Plaza Business Trust by Dawn M. Becker, its Vice President and General Counsel. Variance relief is requested from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) - Table of Sign Regulations — Attachment 1 (Chart), to permit ten (10) wall-mounted enterprise signs for the existing Giant supermarket in lieu of the permitted one (1) sign pursuant to Section 450.4 Chart 1.5(d). The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan and sign package elevations, which were submitted into evidence and marked as Petitioners' Exhibits 1 and 2 respectively.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request were Ronald Brumbaugh, Senior Manager of Construction for Giant, Mark Johnston of Gutschick, Little & Weber, P.A, the civil engineering firm that prepared the site plan(s) for the project, and Warren Weaver of Gable Signs. Charles B. Marek, III, Esquire represented the Petitioner at the hearing. There were no Protestants or other interested persons present.

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Mr. Marek proffered the evidence presented at the hearing, and the proffer and exhibits were accepted into the record of the case. The property in question is the "White Marsh Plaza" near the intersection of Perry Hall Boulevard and Honeygo Boulevard. The site is adjacent to Ring Road, a private road that encircles the White Marsh Mall. The property also sits in between "access road 4" and "access road 5" that connect Ring Road to Honeygo Boulvard and Perry Hall Boulevard respectively. The site is approximately 7.2 acres and is zoned B.M.-C.T. The center is improved with a multi-tenant retail building and a stand-alone PAD site bank. The Giant supermarket is the largest tenant in the center and considered the "anchor" store. In addition to being the anchor store, testimony revealed that Giant has a total of twelve (12) stores in Baltimore County and employs roughly 1,200 people. The chain is an important economic driver of the County, as well as the State of Maryland, and works with local businesses and farms.

Giant is going through a global reimaging of its stores, whereby the longstanding "big G" signage is being replaced with a "fruit-bowl" type logo and associated Giant lettering. As part of this change over from the old trademark to the new, Giant is upgrading not only the sign package, but also has allocated a significant sum to upgrade the interior of these stores. This reimaging to the "fruit-bowl" logo and associated signage will take place not only in Baltimore County, but across Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania and the other markets of Giant.

Testimony also focused on the aspects specific to the property that make it appropriate for variance relief. Although this site is over seven (7) acres, it acts as more of an out parcel or large PAD site of the White Marsh Mall. It borders directly on Ring Road, the private mall beltway, and is accessed off of appropriately named access roads connecting the public and private streets. The effect of the mall is such that it dictates the loading zones of the site be

developed along the collector public roads and not facing the smaller scale pedestrian space of Ring Road and the mall parking areas. Likewise, the boomerang shape of the site dictates a curving of the commercial building, thereby shielding the interior middle anchor tenant, which happens to be Giant, from having adequate visibility from the public roads. It is not until the intersection of Ring Road (passed the center entrance) until these signs are visible from public space, and even then only portions of the building front are clearly visible.

These peculiar aspects of the property work in concert to create a practical difficulty for the supermarket, which is the inability to adequately alert the customers to their presence in the center as well as their multitude of services. This leads to decreased economic vibrancy of the store and the center as a whole. Due to the consolidation of uses under one roof, stores with large building footprints (i.e. big box) are unable to adequately advertise their services. I believe that through the granting of the variance the Petitioner is able to remedy this practical difficulty.

The testimony and evidence also showed that the granting of the variance would be in the spirit and intent of the zoning regulations. The wall mounted signage permitted at this center, without relief, would be one (1) sign that is 557.6 square feet (two times the length of the wall to which the signage is affixed). The wall mounted sign package would be just over half of this permitted square footage at less than 300 square feet. Furthermore, the sign regulations do attempt to allow stores to adequately advertise their services, and I believe that this relief is in keeping with that and other goals of the signage regulations. Lastly, customer recognition and identification of the stores is important as this reimaging is occurring not just in Baltimore County, but throughout all of Giant's operation across counties and states.

The testimony also bears that the granting of the variance will be in the interest of the public. The new sign package will utilize light-emitting-diode (LED) technology for illumination, thereby reducing the energy consumption by roughly ninety (90%) percent.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on the Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this

day of October 2010 that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section

450.4 Chart 1.5(d) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) — Table of Sign Regulations — to permit (10) wall-mounted enterprise signs for the existing Giant supermarket in lieu of the permitted one (1), in accordance with Petitioners' Exhibits 1 and 2, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restriction:

ADVISORY: The Petitioner is advised that it may apply for any required sign permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, the Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.

Any appeal of this Order shall be taken in accordance with Baltimore County Code (B.C.C.) Section 32-3-401.

We are pleased to submit the following parking analysis for the White Marsh Plaza that is located at 7944 Honeygo Boulevard, White Marsh. The property is situated on the northeast corner of Perry Hall Boulevard and Honeygo Boulevard. The purpose of this analysis is to demonstrate the proposed parking reduction at the White Marsh Plaza is adequate to support the existing and proposed uses contained within the shopping center during the average weekday and Saturday peak parking demand periods.

The White Marsh Plaza is a commercial shopping center with a total floor area of 79,609 SF. The existing building floor area will not be increased with this proposal. The existing site plan shows 387 off-street parking spaces that was approved with a parking variance in 2013. The proposed site plan now shows 381 off-street parking spaces.

Methodology

The methodology used to predict the total peak hour parking demand includes parking data contained in the *Institute of transportation Engineers Parking Generation Manual* 5th Edition (ITE) and a parking counts conducted at the White Marsh Plaza. The ITE Parking Manual is a collection of parking (demand) data that were collected throughout the United States for many different land-use types. This report contains ITE peak period parking calculations that are derived from the gross floor area of the existing White Marsh Plaza buildings. The parking data are provided for the peak time periods on a weekday and a Saturday.

ITE: Peak Hour Parking Demand

The ITE parking data listed in Table I represents the peak hour parking demand for uses contained in a single standalone building with a separate parking lot. The uses and the floor area match the floor area that is contained in the White Marsh Plaza shopping center. Since the ITE data in Table I represents standalone uses, the calculated weekday and Saturday peak hour parking demand represents a worst-case parking demand situation. As shown by the ITE manual, the highest parking demand occurred on a Saturday with 372 occupied parking spaces.

The ITE parking data contained in Table II is derived from a 77,634 SF shopping center that contains various tenants that are contained within a single building. The ITE definition for a Shopping Center is "an integrated group of commercial establishments that is planned, developed, owned, and managed as a unit. A shopping center may also contain pad sites for other uses. In this case the White Marsh Plaza contains a pad site for a 1,975 SF standalone bank building. Therefore, the parking calculations for the bank were calculated separate from the shopping center building. The total building area analyzed is 79,609 SF.

The peak hour parking demand for a shopping center occurs on a Saturday with 261 occupied spaces.

Actual Parking Counts

The peak hour observations and counts for this site were counted in April 2013 on a Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. The available parking spaces on site were 387. The highest number of occupied parking spaces counted during the study periods was 179 or 46.3 percent of the available spaces.

Recent parking counts and observations were conducted on January, 14, 2021 (Thursday) January, 15, 2021 (Friday), and January, 16, 2021 (Saturday). The counts were conducted during the COVID -19 closures that may have impacted the demand at the shopping center. The results of the recent counts determined that no more than 143 spaces were occupied, which is 37 percent of the available parking paces.

Conclusions

The ITE parking analysis that was conducted for each tenant located within the shopping center (Table I) is based on the assumption that each use is a standalone use with no shared parking that is typically associated with a shopping center. This analysis determined a maximum parking demand of 372 spaces, which is below the proposed 381 spaces.

The ITE parking analysis conducted for a 79,609 SF shopping center would generate a maximum of 261 occupied parking spaces. This is 69 percent of the total 381 spaces proposed on the site. This peak hour parking demand analysis for a shopping center with 261 occupied spaces more closely matches the actual parking demand count that was conducted in 2013. The 2013 peak hour parking counts revealed the maximum number of occupied spaces was 179, which is 47 percent of the proposed 381 spaces.

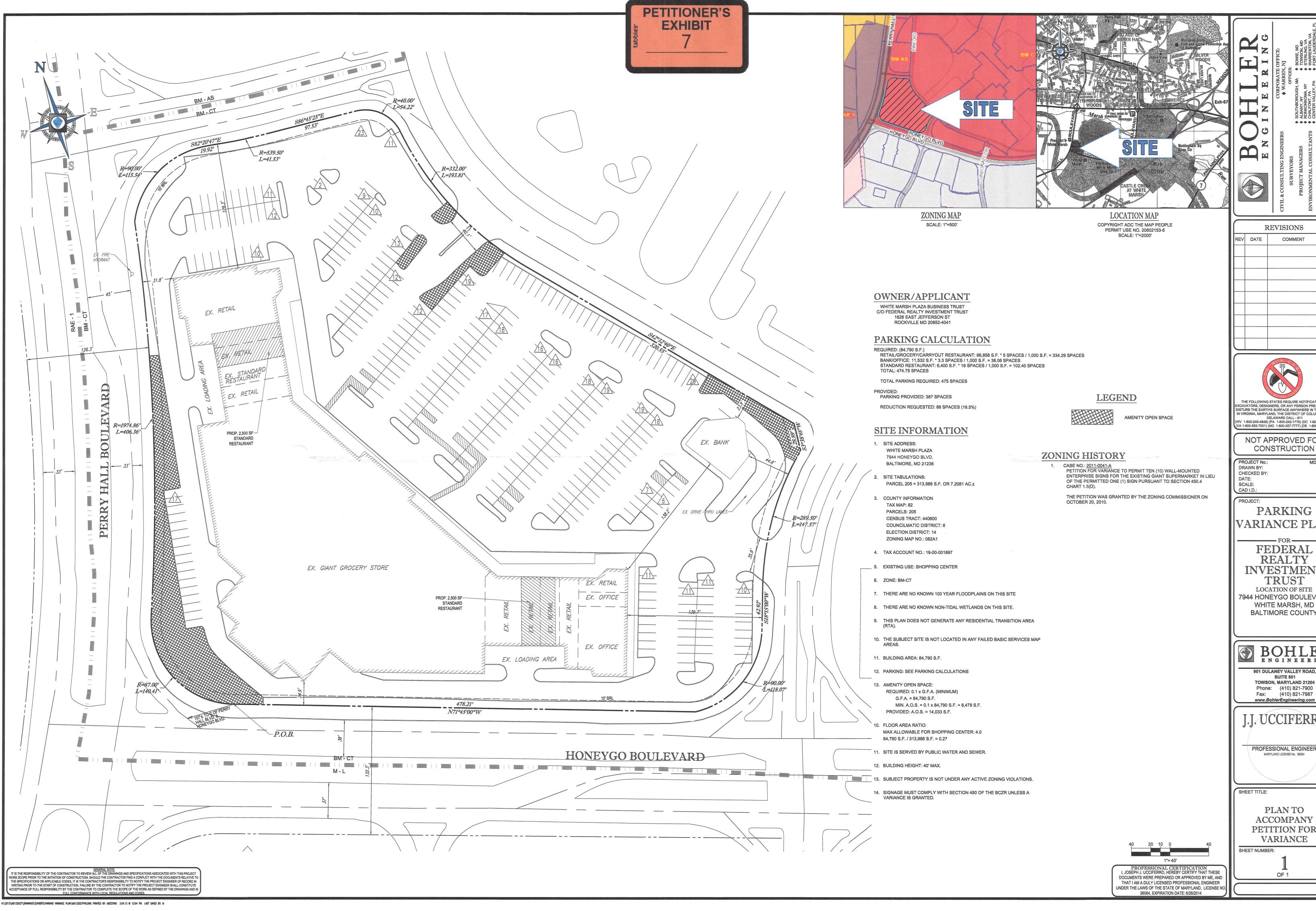
