#### **OPINION**

This case comes to the Board of Appeals of Baltimore County ("Board") as an appeal from an Administrative Law Judge's ("ALJ") Opinion and Order dated May 10, 2023, wherein the Petition for Variance from BCZR §1B02.3.C.1 to permit a minimum side yard setback of five (5) feet in lieu of the required ten (10) feet and twenty-five (25) feet, was denied.

A virtual public hearing was held *de novo* before this Board on August 9, 2023, and a virtual public deliberation was held on September 13, 2023.

Petitioner was represented by Adam M. Rosenblatt, Esquire, and Venable LLP. Also appearing on Petitioner's behalf as an expert witness was surveyor Brian Dietz. There were no Protestants or interested parties in attendance.

#### **FACTS**

The subject property (the "Property") is a thirty-one (31) foot wide residential lot, comprising 5,000 square feet, more or less. It is located in East Towson on the north side of Hillen Road at its intersection with Hendrickson Lane, which borders the east side of the Property. The Property was created as part of an 1883 record plat entitled "Plat of the Land Belonging to the Relief Association of Baltimore County, Maryland." (Petitioner's Exhibit 5) The Property is bounded on the north and west by the rear building lines of the Mt. Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church, which fronts on Eudowood Lane and has no access to

Hillen Road. The remaining lots of the original subdivision appear to be improved with single family houses.

Unlike other properties in the area, the Property is split zoned, divided diagonally by the D.R. 16 and D.R. 10.5 zone line. It is also narrower than other lots in the subdivision, is angled rather than rectangular, and is pinched by the acute angle formed by the intersection of Hillen Road and Hendrickson Lane.

The Property rises from the front to the rear in a northerly direction, limiting the buildable area to the front of the Property. To the east of the site is multi-family housing and across Hillen Road are row homes.

#### STANDARD OF REVIEW

Pursuant to BCZR §307.1, the Board has the power to grant a variance from the BCZR's area regulations "only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship." In addition, "any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said . . . area . . . regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to public health, safety and general welfare." BCZR § 307.1.

In *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md. App. 691, 651 A.2d 424 (1994), the Court of Special Appeals has set forth the analytical framework for considering a request for a variance:

[I]t is at least a two-step process. The first step requires a finding that the property whereon structures are to be placed (or uses conducted) is – in and of itself – unique and unusual in a manner different from the nature of surrounding properties such that the uniqueness and peculiarity of the subject property causes the zoning provision to impact disproportionately upon that property. Unless there is a finding that the property is unique, unusual, or different, the process stops here and

the variance is denied without any consideration of practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship. If that first step results in a supportable finding of uniqueness or unusualness, then a second step is taken in the process, i.e., a determination of whether practical difficulty and/or unreasonable hardship, result from the disproportionate impact of the ordinance caused by the property's uniqueness.

In an earlier case, the Court also discussed the basis for granting an area variance.

In order to justify the grant of an area variance the applicant need show only that:

- 1) Whether compliance with the strict letter of the restrictions governing area, setbacks, frontage, height, bulk or density would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2) Whether a grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district, or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.

(Anderson v. Board of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 322 A.2d 220, 22 Md. App. 28 (Md. App. 1974)); and

3) Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

(*McLean v. Soley*, 270 Md. 208, 214-215, 310 A.2d 783, 787 (1973), quoting 2 Rathkopf, The Law of [322 A.2d 227] Zoning and Planning, 45-28-29 (3d ed. 1972).)

Both the Cromwell and Anderson analyses can be applied here.

#### **TESTIMONY AND EVIDENCE**

Counsel Rosenblatt proffered much of the factual information about the Property. The zoning of the Property creates setbacks that overlap and completely eliminate any area of the Property on which a residence may be built, a situation that renders the Property unusable for any permitted purpose.

Mr. Rosenblatt noted for the record for the purpose of preserving the legal issue, if needed, that where there is a denial of any permitted use, a variance is an appropriate tool to avoid a taking, citing *Maryland Reclamation Assocs. Inc. v. Harford Cnty.*, 414 Md. 1, 994 A.2d 842 (Md. 2010).

In addition, Mr. Rosenblatt pointed out to the Board that there was no opposition from neighboring uses nor from the East Towson Community Association, which is known for being active, informed and vocal about issues affecting the East Towson area.

The owner, Mr. Tooks also testified, informing the Board that he only learned that he owned the Property in 2020 upon his mother's death. Despite their inability to obtain a permit to build on the Property, his family has been paying taxes based on the Property's assessment as a buildable site. Mr. Tooks also testified that he contacted the adjoining church to determine if the church wished to purchase the Property, but no one responded to him.

Surveyor Brian Dietz, accepted as an expert witness, testified about the 1883 plat, (Petitioner's Exhibit 5) the history of the Property and its unique characteristics, i.e., its angled shape, its narrowness, its corner location and the fact that no other property in the area has a church wrapping around two sides of the property. Mr. Dietz also researched the records of the Baltimore County Department of Public Works and Transportation to ascertain prior use of the Property. Based on utility position sheets, (Petitioner's Exhibit 7) a house once sat on this Property, perhaps as recently as the 1950's.

Upon inquiry by the Board and in response to a Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment regarding the location of the proposed driveway, Mr. Dietz opined that the grades limited the siting of the house and driveway, but that it may be possible to slide them further northwest to the rear of the Property by ten or fifteen feet.

Mr. Rosenblatt offered closing remarks, first citing the legal criteria of the *Anderson* case and how the facts here satisfy that standard: compliance with the strict letter of the setbacks would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for *any* permitted purpose; a grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district; relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Mr. Rosenblatt also addressed the ZAC comment from the Office of Planning regarding provisions of the Towson Community Plan for the East Towson area (Petitioner's Exhibit 6). That plan, adopted over thirty years ago, identifies residential use as the preferred use in this area, and encourages residential development of various infill parcels. The plan calls for the development of housing on vacant parcels as a preferred use and the development of affordable housing on vacant parcels to support the primary objective of neighborhood stabilization

Aspirational language in the plan refers to the expansion of the church, possibly onto the area of the Property. It was noted that the church did not respond to Mr. Tooks' overtures, nor did any representative appear at the hearing or communicate to the Board about this variance request. The Board notes that in the late 1990's, subsequent to the adoption of the Towson plan, the church expanded and built the large building whose rear walls of which now forms an "L" around the subject property.

#### **FINDINGS**

The Board finds that the Property at 379 Hillen Road is unique based on its zoning, its configuration and corner location, all of which distinguish it from other properties in the area. The split zone on the Property effects a practical difficulty in that it deprives the owner of any permitted use.

Similarly, there is no question that strict compliance unreasonably prevents the use of the Property for a permitted purpose. The grant of the variances would do substantial justice both to the owner and other properties in the neighborhood. It is a residential use in a residential area, in keeping with the variety of housing types in the immediate area and with other homes built on lots platted when this Property was created.

The Property has been taxed and treated by both the State of Maryland and Baltimore County as a buildable lot. It is intended to be improved as a single-family home, creating a residential use in a residential area.

The Board further finds that there is no conflict between the proposal and the Towson Community Plan, which has not been updated to reflect current conditions in East Towson. Even so, the expansion of the church occurred as envisioned by the plan, but did not extend to the Property.

Lastly, the Board believes it is in the interest of the Petitioner and the community that the Petitioner submits his architectural house plans and a landscape plan for review and approval to the Office of Planning prior to building permit.

#### ORDER

**THEREFORE, IT IS THIS** 13th day of October, 2023, by the Board of Appeals of Baltimore County, hereby

**ORDERED**, that Petition for Variance from BCZR §1B02.3.C.1 to permit a minimum side yard setback of five (5) feet in lieu of the required ten (10) feet and twenty-five (25) feet be and the same is hereby **GRANTED**, subject to the following condition:

Petitioner submits his architectural house plans and a landscape plan for review and approval to the Office of Planning prior to building permit.

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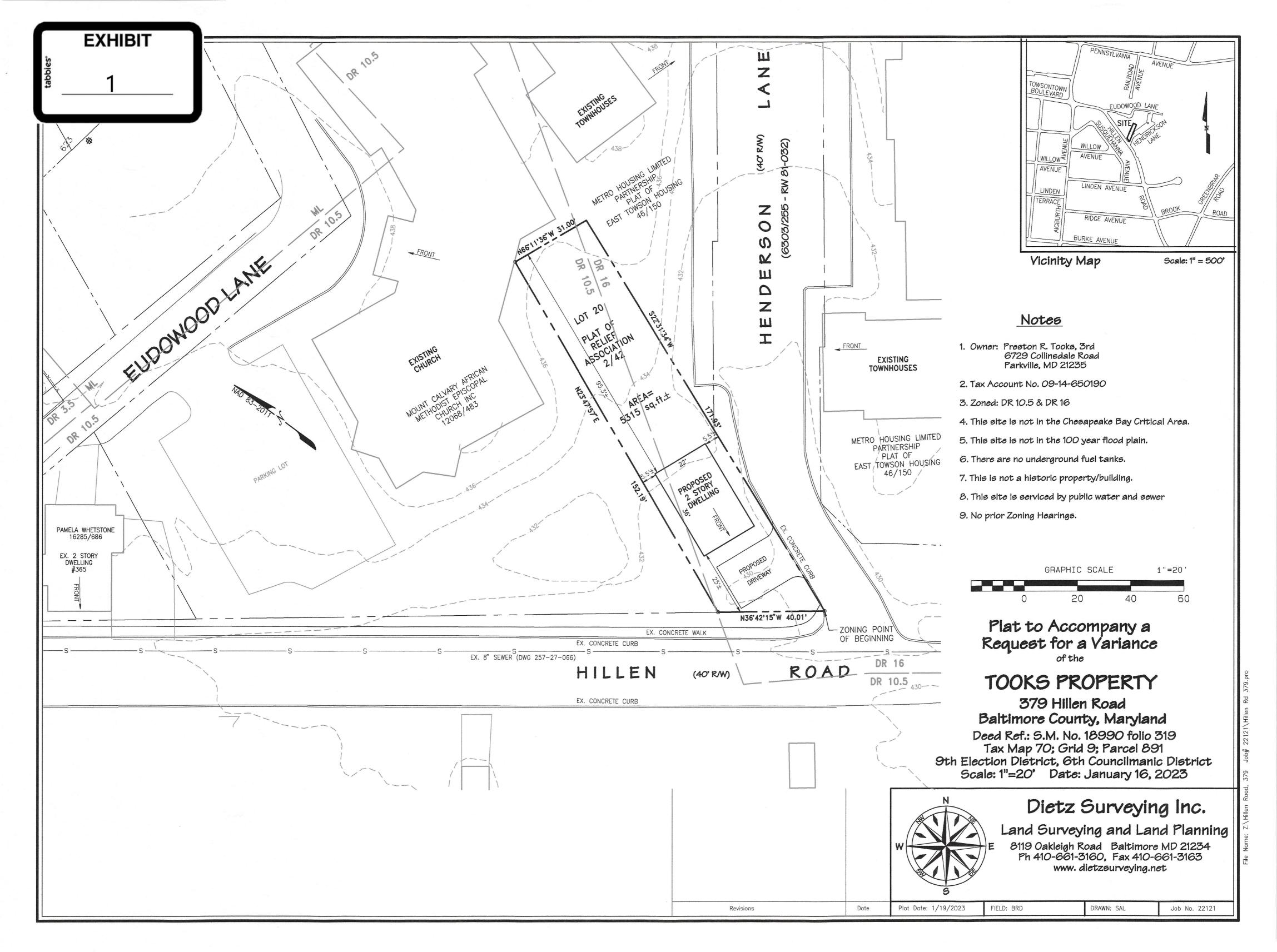

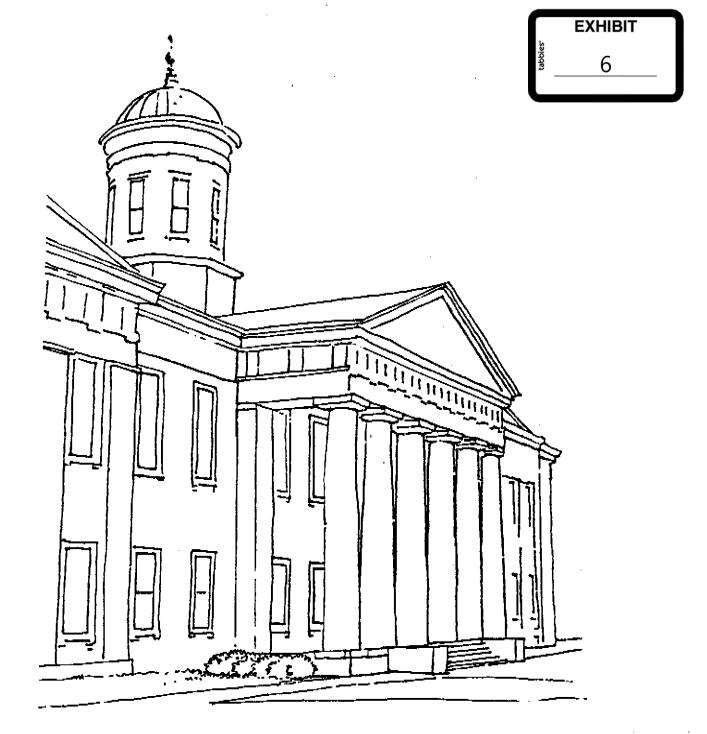

# TOWSON COMMUNITY PLAN

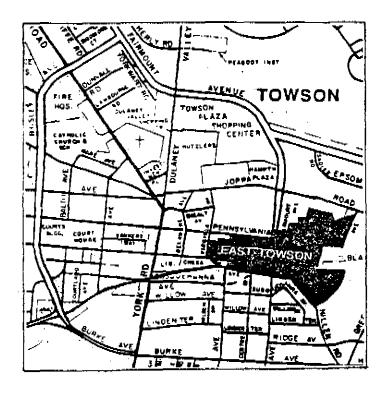
As Adopted By The Baltimore County Council on February 3, 1992

#### INTRODUCTION

The residents of East Towson have expressed their hopes and desires to preserve and restore this historic African American Community. This document is a plan to remain the oldest existing community in Towson.

Today, East Towson is a quiet residential community with tree lined streets located on the eastern fringe of the Towson Town Center (See Map 1). It enjoys many advantages due to its proximity to the central business district, conversely this proximity has generated development pressures and traffic issues related to its location.

The original property owners were freed slaves who until 1830 had been in service at the Hampton Mansion. The East Towson community is the only remaining portion of the larger African American community that from 1830 to 1960 extended as far as the York Road and Bosley Avenue area, in an area known as "Sandy Bottom," and in North Towson and West Towson. The North and West Towson African American communities no longer exist. The newly reconstructed Mt. Olive Baptist Church and church owned duplex located on the Southwest corner of York and Bosley are the visible reminders that the York Road commercial corridor was once home to a large African American community.

#### I ACTION PLAN

The Baltimore County Master Plan 1989-2000 designated certain areas of the County as "enhancement areas." They were defined as "communities that have experienced a degree of physical decline and require County action to address specific problems such as poor condition of public facilities and private housing stock." (p.38)

Enhancement areas are located primarily in older areas of Baltimore County; some border commercial centers.

Action plans should be developed for these enhancement areas in order to stabilize these residential communities, and to continue to make them desirable places in which to live. They should have priority for the use of C.I.P. (Capital Improvement Program) funds for infrastructure improvements, open space acquisition, community services and facilities as well as for affordable housing. These improvements will foster civic involvement among the communities' current residents and may favorably influence prospective home buyers

#### DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

The following chart indicates the population changes from 1970 - 1990 within the East Towson community (See Map 21). Residents report that the neighborhood population is aging.

#### PROCESS

The East Towson African American Community has developed a community conservation plan for this enhancement area in order to achieve neighborhood stabilization, redevelopment of affordable infill housing and adequate buffers and protection from commercial encroachment of the Towson commercial core.

A community work group comprised of East Towson property owners and residents worked to develop an action plan for strengthening the residential community. Meetings were held often and were open to the public. Business owners and developers were invited to discuss development proposals as well as short and long-term plans, for sites near the community; the seven who participated by giving presentations and answering questions were:

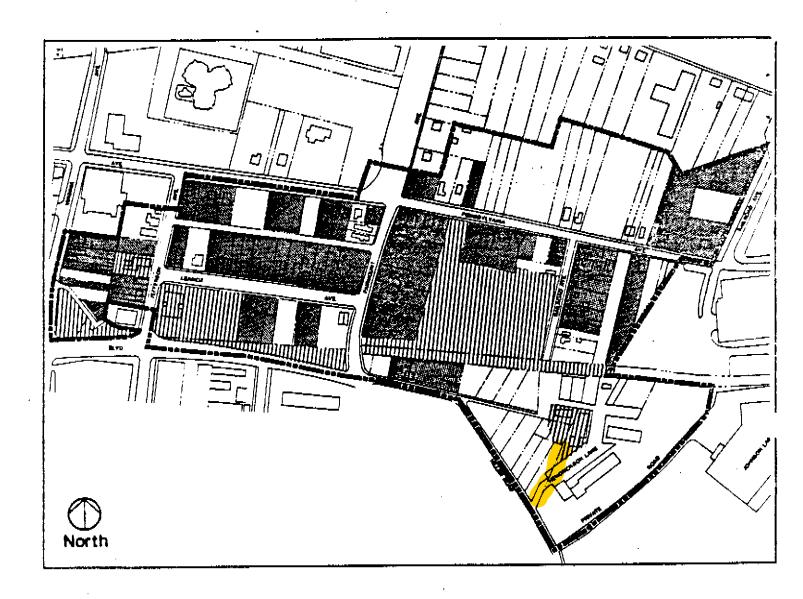
#### 1. Existing Land use

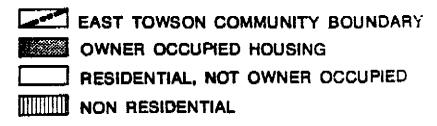
The East Towson community conservation plan comprises approximately 31 acres t with the predominant land use being single family and semi-detached dwellings and townhouses. Additional uses include the two churches, the St. James A.U.M.P. Church at 413 Jefferson Avenue and the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church at 300 Eudowood Lane and the Carver School at 300 Lennox Avenue. These institutional uses serve as anchors for this community. The Elks Lodge at 411 E. Pennsylvania Avenue is a fraternal organization that is an important social organization within the community.

Other non-residential land uses include the Baltimore Gas & Electric sub-station, Cambrill's Plumbing and Heating Contractor's office at 318 E. Pennsylvania Avenue and Technigraphics of Maryland at 398 Eudowood Lane.

#### 2. Proposed Land Uses

Development of affordable housing on vacant parcels is the preferred use, since neighborhood stabilization is the primary objective of this Plan. The "transitional blocks" along the east side of Virginia Avenue and the south side of Pennsylvania should retain the RO zoning classification or be rezoned to ROA. The existing patterns of single family or semi-detached buildings should remain.





The Elks Lodge should remain at its present location on 411 E. Pennsylvania Avenue. Future plans to renovate or expand the Elks Lodge should be reviewed with the community prior to submittal to Baltimore County.

Expansion and renovation of the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church is highly desirable to better serve the needs of the community.

The Carver School should be renovated for use as a community/recreation center. A portion of the building is used for a Head Start program and meeting rooms and there is an existing outdoor recreation area. A structural assessment of the building is necessary to determine the feasibility of a full conversion.

The Baltimore Gas & Electric sub-station located in the area since 1952 should remain at its location on the south side of Pennsylvania Avenue and the west side of Railroad Avenue. The Baltimore Gas & Electric Company will work with both the community and the Office of Planning & Zoning to provide better landscaping/screening around the perimeter of the substation.

Technigraphics of Maryland, formerly Maryland Etching, may remain at its location on Eudowood Lane. Future expansion plans should be reviewed with the East Towson community prior to their submittal to Baltimore County. In the long term, this site should be considered for housing as illustrated on the design plan on Map 24.

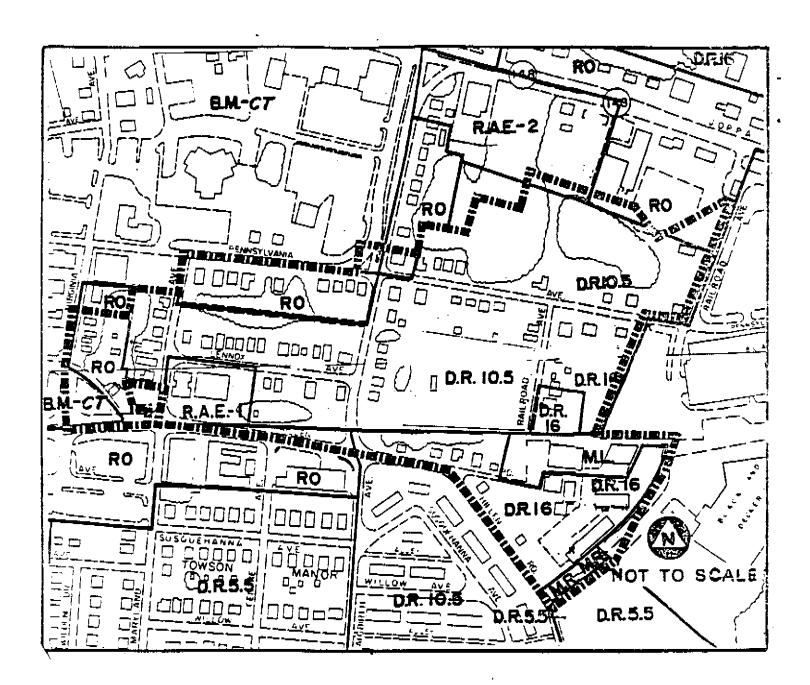
#### B. ZONING

#### 1. Existing Zoning

The use and density allowed by the existing zoning designations do not protect and preserve the remaining residential community. Previous Towson plans assumed that the "loop road" would be widened and completed and that the property within "the loop" would be commercially redeveloped.

From 1971-1980, the houses on Virginia, Jefferson and Lennox Avenues were zoned BM-CT, Business Major with a Town-Center district. The remaining houses were zoned DR 16, a classification that is more appropriate for garden apartments or multi-family dwellings than for single family and semi-detached housing.

In 1980, the RO (Residential Office) zone was established which was intended to provide a transition between commercial and residential zones. The BM-CT designation was rezoned and RO put in place on the east side of Virginia



Avenue and on the south side of Pennsylvania between Jefferson and Fairmount and along Fairmount Avenue north of Pennsylvania Avenue. Most of the remaining residential community was rezoned from DR 16 to DR 10.5, a category more in keeping with lot sizes and densities. DR 16 was retained for the Hendrickson Lane Apartment sites as well as the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church.

Generally, the RO zoned parcels have not been converted to office uses, but have remained residential. These homes form a significant part of the community. There is no effective transition from the Town Center to the residential community.

Since 1980, zoning patterns have remained essentially the same except in 1988 when the Carver School was rezoned from DR 10.5 to RAE 1 in an effort to redevelop the site with elderly housing.

The East Towson community plan area consists of the following zoning classifications: RO (Residential Office), DR 10.5, (10.5 dwelling units per acre), DR 16, (16 dwelling units per acre) and RAE 1, (40 dwelling units per acre) and ML, (Manufacturing Light). (See Map 22.)

The approximate acreage by zone is as follows:

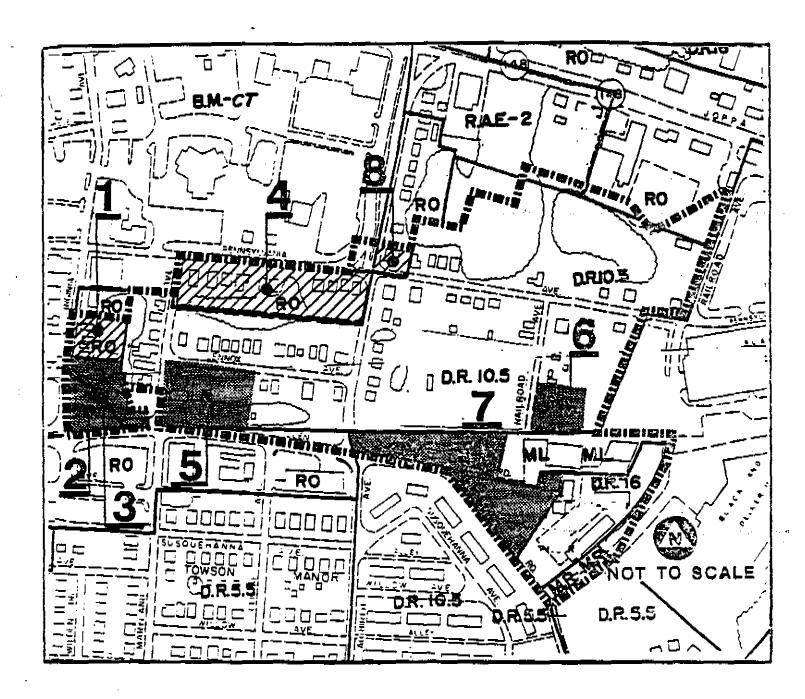

#### 2. Proposed Zoning

The zoning should provide opportunities for infill housing, renovation/restoration of the Carver School for use as a community building, and the expansion of Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church. Zoning should provide an effective transition from the town center to the residential community as well as stability for the residential community. Infill housing should be in accordance with design guidelines which will be developed in the Design portion of the plan.

The following zoning changes should occur through the 1992 Comprehensive Zoning process (See Map 23.)

Technigraphics of Maryland, formerly Maryland Etching Company, occupies the ML zoned property on Eudowood Lane. The ML zoning should remain in place for the present time. However, Baltimore County Economic Development Commission and the Office of Planning and Zoning should assist the printing company in relocating to a more suitable site outside the East Towson community. If this relocation occurs, rezoning the site to DR 10.5 is appropriate.

#### C. ZONING REGULATIONS

#### 1. Uses by Right in DR Zones

- A. Infill affordable housing is the preferred use within the plan area.
  - 1. Definition of Affordable Housing

Affordable Housing for the East Towson community is defined as housing affordable to households with income at or below 80 percent of the Baltimore area median income. For a family of four that this income limit would currently be \$34,800. Affordability would generally be determined through the proportion of monthly income required for housing, which should not exceed 30 to 35 percent. The 1991 income levels representing 80 percent of the Baltimore area median by household size are shown below:

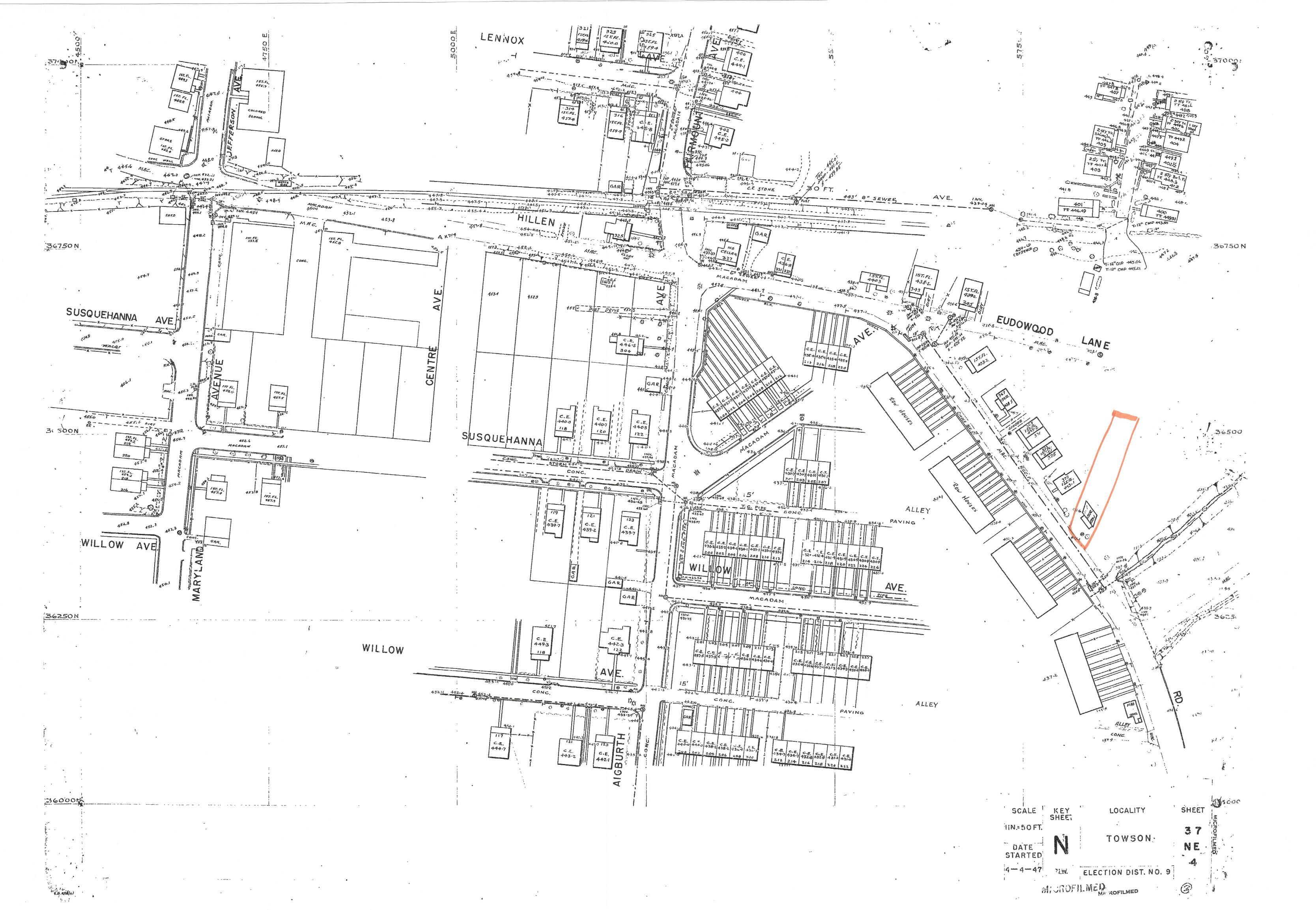
The rent or sale price affordable to households with income at or below this level varies depending on the type of assistance provided. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) loans to a nonprofit developer may be applied to pre-development, land acquisition or construction costs to reduce housing costs. Buyers may also be assisted with CDBG funds for soft second mortgages or state funds which provide low-interest mortgage and/or settlement expense loans.

- B. The following uses will be permitted within the plan boundaries:
  - Dwellings, including, but not limited to, one-family detached houses, one-family semi-detached houses, one-family group houses, patio houses, side-and-back- attached houses, two-family houses, town-house apartment buildings (including group-house apartment buildings), garden apartment buildings, and other apartment buildings.

In the case of housing for the elderly and assisted living facilities of fewer than four, see Section 432. [Bill No. 36, 1988.]

- Local open space tracts or other common amenity open space.
- 3. Privately sponsored day care and nursery programs, as an ancillary use, within housing for the elderly projects, as defined in Section 101 of these regulations. [Bill No. 47, 1982.]
- Accessory uses or buildings other than those permitted by Special Exception
  - a. Swimming pools, tennis courts, garages, sheds
  - b. Family child care homes for up to eight children in accordance with Bill 7-91.
- 5. Group child care centers and nursery schools within
  - a. Churches
  - b. Community Buildings
  - c. School Buildings
  - d. Residences as a Special Exception
- C. Residential transition area (r.t.a.) definitions, uses and restrictions should remain in place in accordance with Section 1B01.1.B of the BCZR. However, r.t.a. standards may be relaxed for affordable infill housing by the County Review Group (CRG) or equivalent hearing officer. Section 1B01.1.B.I.c. exceptions to residential transition area may need to be amended.
  - A community input meeting must be held and the Compatibility/Design Review Process must occur prior to the granting of relief from r.t.a. standards.

#### OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") as a Petition for Variance filed by the Petitioner, Preston R. Tooks, III ("Petitioner") for property located at 379 Hillen Road, Towson (the "Lot 20"). The Petitioner is requesting Variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), §1B02.3.C.1 to permit a minimum side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 and 25 ft.

A public WebEx hearing was conducted virtually in lieu of an in-person hearing. The Petition was properly advertised and posted. Petitioner appeared in support of the Petition along with Brian Dietz of Dietz Surveying, Inc., licensed surveyor, who prepared and sealed a site plan (the "Site Plan"). (Pet. Ex.1). Adam M. Rosenblatt, Esquire of Venable, LLP represented the Petitioner. There were no Protestants or interested citizens that appeared at the hearing.

Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Planning ("DOP") who opposed the requested relief for the following reasons:

- 1. Although the Towson Community Plan describes the importance of affordable infill housing, the proposed location is designated as church expansion.
- 2. The proposal for the subject site does not appear to be consistent with the immediate area, which is composed primarily of townhomes and some single family dwellings (Hillen Road at

Eudowood Lane and Hillen Road at Linden Avenue) on larger lots of 47 + feet in width.

3. The proposed site layout does not appear to be consistent with the area. The submitted site plan shows a proposed driveway/parking pad in the front yard of the dwelling: a similar lot layout cannot be found in the area.

While recognizing that Lot 20 was narrow, the DOP added that the proposal is inconsistent with the character of the East Towson Community Conservation Area, and therefore would have an adverse impact on the community.

The case was proffered by Mr. Rosenblatt. Lot 20 is a 5,315 sf +/-, unimproved, elongated lot which was created on the Plat of Land Belonging to the Relief Association of Baltimore County, MD recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on August 2, 1906 (Plat Book 2, page 42) (the "1906 Plat"). (Pet. Ex. 5). Lot 20 sits on the corner of Hillen Road and Hendrickson Lane. (Pet. Ex. 1). It is split-zoned in unequal proportions, with the majority of Lot 20 having DR16 on the eastern side, and DR10.5 on the western side. As shown on the aerial photograph, adjoining Lot 20 on its western side is the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church (the "AME Church"). (Pet. Ex. 3). The AME Church encompasses the entire triangular shaped block other than Lot 20 and Lot 25. Lot 25 has a single family dwelling which was constructed in 1924. To the north, west and south of Lot 20 are townhomes. (Id.). There are no single family dwellings immediately surrounding Lot 20. As shown in the street view photographs, Lot 20 is vacant with mature trees, bushes, and grass areas. (Pet. Exs. 4A-4F).

Petitioner proposes to construct a 2-story, 792 sf single family dwelling fronting on Hillen Road with driveway accessing onto Hendrickson Lane. (Pet. Ex. 1). Due to the width of Lot 20, Petitioner is requesting Variance relief for side yard setbacks of 5.5 ft. on each side in lieu of the required 10 ft. on the DR 10.5 side, and in lieu of the required 25 ft. on the DR 16 side. Mr.

Rosenblatt stated that Petitioner offered to sell Lot 20 to the AME Church but the offer was declined. He also stated that Petitioner desired to construct a home for his adult children.

During the hearing Mr. Rosenblatt highlighted parts of the Towson Community Plan, and specifically the East Towson Community Conservation Area, to emphasize that the predominant land use was both single family, semi-detached and townhouses and that development of affordable housing on vacant parcels is the preferred use. (Pet. Ex. 6) Also highlighted was the provision that: "Expansion and renovation of the Mt. Calvary AME Church is highly desirable to better serve the needs of the community." (*Id.*). Additionally, as emphasized by DOP, it was also noted that "Mt. Calvary is acquiring these properties for church expansion." (*Id.*). After the hearing, Mr. Rosenblatt also provided a document entitled: "Baltimore County Position Sheet" showing the Lots from the 1906 Plat (the "Position Sheet"). (Pet. Ex. 7).

#### **VARIANCE**

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

With regard to uniqueness, I find that the Lot 20 is arguably unique under *Cromwell* in that, while it is rectangular in shape and therefore similar to other lots on the 1906 Plat, it does have dimensions which are different from the other lots. As such, I agree that the Petitioner has met that part of the test.

To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must produce evidence to allow each of the following questions to be answered affirmatively:

- 1. That compliance with the strict letter of the restriction would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2. Whether the grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners; and
- 3. Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28, 39 (1974). The general rule is that "the authority to grant a variance should be exercised sparingly and only under exceptional circumstances." Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County, 177 Md. App. 43, 71(2007). This is because "a variance is an authorization for that which is prohibited by a zoning ordinance." Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691, 699 (1995). And because "citizens [of a given county or municipality] are entitled to strict enforcement of the existing zoning regulations." Salisbury Bd. Of Zoning Appeals v. Bounds, 240 Md. 547, 555-56 (1965). Therefore, "[t]he burden is on the applicant to show facts to warrant a variance," and "the specific need for the variance must be substantial and urgent and not merely for the convenience of the applicant." Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County, 177 Md. App. at 70.

With regard to practical difficulty, all 3 of the factors set forth in *Chesapeake Beach*, *supra*, must be met. While I understand Petitioner's argument that the first factor has been met because, that without Variance relief for side yard setbacks, the Petitioner will not be able to construct the home as proposed, the narrow width of Lot 20 was created in 1906, prior to the BCZR and is likely the reason that it has remained vacant. The Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual ("ZCPM"), § 103.1.A provides that for vacant lots recorded prior to 1945, the current area regulations apply.

Notwithstanding that the Position Sheet shows various structures on each of the Lots created on the 1906 Plat, it is unclear when, or from where, the Position Sheet originated. (Pet. Ex. 7). It is also unclear whether the structures shown on each lot were ever constructed. If the structures were built on each lot, each would then have been razed when lots were gifted to the Church. Based on the evidence presented, Lot 20 was never improved with a single family home as there was no evidence presented of a foundation, and no information in regard to an alleged demolition.

In regard to the second and third factors in *Chesapeake Beach*, I agree with the DOP's reasoning in support of their objection to the requested relief. I find that the granting of the Variance here would <u>not</u> do substantial justice to the neighboring property owners and would <u>not</u> be consistent with justice to those other property owners, including the AME Church, and existing townhome communities. Toward that end, in reviewing the facts in this Case, I cannot ignore the dramatic change in the neighborhood which has occurred since Lot 20 was created on the 1906 Plat. Comparing the aerial photograph to the 1906 Plat, only Lots 1-6 along Eudowood Lane, and Lot 25 (Ms. Whetstone's 1924 home), have single family dwellings. All of those homes are removed from Lot 20.

Moreover, Hendrickson Lane was constructed through at least Lots 15, 16 and 17, and runs immediately along the eastern boundary of Lot 20. Hendrickson Lane is a road between Hillen Road and Eudowood Lane, and it provides access for three (3) groups of townhomes. In fact, one of those townhome groups was constructed on part of Lot 19; a single family home was not constructed there. To permit a new access driveway onto Hendrickson Lane nearly at the corner with Hillen Road, negatively impacts the safety of drivers accustomed to using Hendrickson Lane to access the townhomes. Additionally, rows of townhomes also encompass many blocks directly

across from Lot 20 on the other side of Hillen Road. There are no single family homes located on the other side of Hillen Road or in the immediate vicinity of Lot 20.

Significantly, the AME Church, its outbuildings, and associated parking lots, occupy Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 18, part of 19, 21, 22, 23 and 24 shown on the 1906 Plat. I take judicial notice that by Deed recorded in Land Records of Baltimore County on March 28, 1997 (Book 12102, page 17), Lot 18 and part of Lot 19 were *gifted (no consideration)* to the Church. Similarly, by Deed recorded in Land Records of Baltimore County on March 6, 1997 (Book 12068, page 483), part of Lot 19, 21, 22, 23, and 24 were also *gifted (no consideration)* to the Church. The aerial photograph and street view photographs give the appearance that Lot 20 is the corner of the Church's property. (Pet. Exs. 3, 4). There are existing mature trees on Lot 20, vegetation and grass which has obviously been maintained by someone. As shown on the aerial photograph, the 1906 Plat, and the Site Plan, on the larger triangular-shaped parcel of land where Lot 20 is located, the Church, and one of its parking lots, occupy the entire triangular parcel, other than Lot 25. Yet, Lot 25, owned by Pamela Whetstone, has a 2-story dwelling constructed in 1924, prior to the construction of the Church and prior to the BCZR. (Pet. Exs. 1). With these facts, to grant a Variance for a proposed home on this vacant Lot 20, would not do substantial injustice to the AME Church and the townhomes community on Hendrickson Lane.

Moreover, I find that the Petitioner has not, and will not, suffer any prejudice in the denial of the Variance. I take judicial notice of a Life Estate Deed recorded in Land Records of Baltimore County on April 5, 2004 (Book 18990, page 319), wherein Doris G. Tooks Simms gifted Lot 20 to her son, the Petitioner. Mr. Rosenblatt proffered that Petitioner was not aware of the existence of Lot 20 until 2020, when an Estate was opened for Ms. Tooks Simms. The earliest Deed that is listed in the SDAT records for Lot 20 (Book 8913, page 91) shows that Lot 20 was transferred to

Ms. Tooks Simms for *no consideration* by the Director of Finance for Baltimore County and Collector of State and County Taxes, after a Tax Sale and Foreclosure proceedings. (See Deed in File). The Foreclosure case was captioned "*Doris G. Tooks Simms v. Patapsco Development Corporation, et al.* (Docket 172, page 108, Case No.: 82 E 3228). Accordingly, neither Ms. Tooks Simms, nor the Petitioner, expended any money in obtaining Lot 20; it was gifted to them by the County. Mr. Rosenblatt stated that, after Petitioner learned of its existence, Petitioner offered to sell it to the Church, but the Church declined to purchase it. While it was also proffered that a proposed home would be for the Petitioner's children, I also take judicial notice that the Google Map for Lot 20 dated September, 2022 has a For-Sale sign.

For the foregoing reasons, the Variance request will be denied.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>10<sup>th</sup></u> day of May 2023 by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance from BCZR, §1B02.3.C.1 to permit a minimum side yard setback of 5 ft, in lieu of the required 10 and 25 ft, and is hereby **DENIED**.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

#### **OPINION AND ORDER**

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") as a Petition for Variance filed by the Petitioner, Preston R. Tooks, III ("Petitioner") for property located at 379 Hillen Road, Towson (the "Lot 20"). The Petitioner is requesting Variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), §1B02.3.C.1 to permit a minimum side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 and 25 ft.

A public WebEx hearing was conducted virtually in lieu of an in-person hearing. The Petition was properly advertised and posted. Petitioner appeared in support of the Petition along with Brian Dietz of Dietz Surveying, Inc., licensed surveyor, who prepared and sealed a site plan (the "Site Plan"). (Pet. Ex.1). Adam M. Rosenblatt, Esquire of Venable, LLP represented the Petitioner. There were no Protestants or interested citizens that appeared at the hearing.

Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Planning ("DOP") who opposed the requested relief for the following reasons:

- 1. Although the Towson Community Plan describes the importance of affordable infill housing, the proposed location is designated as church expansion.
- 2. The proposal for the subject site does not appear to be consistent with the immediate area, which is composed primarily of townhomes and some single family dwellings (Hillen Road at

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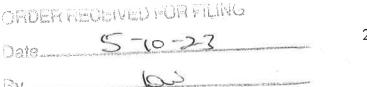
Eudowood Lane and Hillen Road at Linden Avenue) on larger lots of 47 + feet in width.

3. The proposed site layout does not appear to be consistent with the area. The submitted site plan shows a proposed driveway/parking pad in the front yard of the dwelling: a similar lot layout cannot be found in the area.

While recognizing that Lot 20 was narrow, the DOP added that the proposal is inconsistent with the character of the East Towson Community Conservation Area, and therefore would have an adverse impact on the community.

The case was proffered by Mr. Rosenblatt. Lot 20 is a 5,315 sf +/-, unimproved, elongated lot which was created on the Plat of Land Belonging to the Relief Association of Baltimore County, MD recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on August 2, 1906 (Plat Book 2, page 42) (the "1906 Plat"). (Pet. Ex. 5). Lot 20 sits on the corner of Hillen Road and Hendrickson Lane. (Pet. Ex. 1). It is split-zoned in unequal proportions, with the majority of Lot 20 having DR16 on the eastern side, and DR10.5 on the western side. As shown on the aerial photograph, adjoining Lot 20 on its western side is the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church (the "AME Church"). (Pet. Ex. 3). The AME Church encompasses the entire triangular shaped block other than Lot 20 and Lot 25. Lot 25 has a single family dwelling which was constructed in 1924. To the north, west and south of Lot 20 are townhomes. (Id.). There are no single family dwellings immediately surrounding Lot 20. As shown in the street view photographs, Lot 20 is vacant with mature trees, bushes, and grass areas. (Pet. Exs. 4A-4F).

Petitioner proposes to construct a 2-story, 792 sf single family dwelling fronting on Hillen Road with driveway accessing onto Hendrickson Lane. (Pet. Ex. 1). Due to the width of Lot 20, Petitioner is requesting Variance relief for side yard setbacks of 5.5 ft. on each side in lieu of the required 10 ft. on the DR 10.5 side, and in lieu of the required 25 ft. on the DR 16 side. Mr.



Rosenblatt stated that Petitioner offered to sell Lot 20 to the AME Church but the offer was declined. He also stated that Petitioner desired to construct a home for his adult children.

During the hearing Mr. Rosenblatt highlighted parts of the Towson Community Plan, and specifically the East Towson Community Conservation Area, to emphasize that the predominant land use was both single family, semi-detached and townhouses and that development of affordable housing on vacant parcels is the preferred use. (Pet. Ex. 6) Also highlighted was the provision that: "Expansion and renovation of the Mt. Calvary AME Church is highly desirable to better serve the needs of the community." (*Id.*). Additionally, as emphasized by DOP, it was also noted that "Mt. Calvary is acquiring these properties for church expansion." (*Id.*). After the hearing, Mr. Rosenblatt also provided a document entitled: "Baltimore County Position Sheet" showing the Lots from the 1906 Plat (the "Position Sheet"). (Pet. Ex. 7).

#### **VARIANCE**

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

With regard to uniqueness, I find that the Lot 20 is arguably unique under *Cromwell* in that, while it is rectangular in shape and therefore similar to other lots on the 1906 Plat, it does have dimensions which are different from the other lots. As such, I agree that the Petitioner has met that part of the test.

To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must produce evidence to allow each of the following questions to be answered affirmatively:

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- 1. That compliance with the strict letter of the restriction would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2. Whether the grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners; and
- 3. Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28, 39 (1974). The general rule is that "the authority to grant a variance should be exercised sparingly and only under exceptional circumstances." Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County, 177 Md. App. 43, 71(2007). This is because "a variance is an authorization for that which is prohibited by a zoning ordinance." Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691, 699 (1995). And because "citizens [of a given county or municipality] are entitled to strict enforcement of the existing zoning regulations." Salisbury Bd. Of Zoning Appeals v. Bounds, 240 Md. 547, 555-56 (1965). Therefore, "[t]he burden is on the applicant to show facts to warrant a variance," and "the specific need for the variance must be substantial and urgent and not merely for the convenience of the applicant." Mueller v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County, 177 Md. App. at 70.

With regard to practical difficulty, all 3 of the factors set forth in *Chesapeake Beach*, *supra*, must be met. While I understand Petitioner's argument that the first factor has been met because, that without Variance relief for side yard setbacks, the Petitioner will not be able to construct the home as proposed, the narrow width of Lot 20 was created in 1906, prior to the BCZR and is likely the reason that it has remained vacant. The Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual ("ZCPM"), §103.1.A provides that for vacant lots recorded prior to 1945, the current area regulations apply.

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Notwithstanding that the Position Sheet shows various structures on each of the Lots created on the 1906 Plat, it is unclear when, or from where, the Position Sheet originated. (Pet. Ex. 7). It is also unclear whether the structures shown on each lot were ever constructed. If the structures were built on each lot, each would then have been razed when lots were gifted to the Church. Based on the evidence presented, Lot 20 was never improved with a single family home as there was no evidence presented of a foundation, and no information in regard to an alleged demolition.

In regard to the second and third factors in *Chesapeake Beach*, I agree with the DOP's reasoning in support of their objection to the requested relief. I find that the granting of the Variance here would <u>not</u> do substantial justice to the neighboring property owners and would <u>not</u> be consistent with justice to those other property owners, including the AME Church, and existing townhome communities. Toward that end, in reviewing the facts in this Case, I cannot ignore the dramatic change in the neighborhood which has occurred since Lot 20 was created on the 1906 Plat. Comparing the aerial photograph to the 1906 Plat, only Lots 1-6 along Eudowood Lane, and Lot 25 (Ms. Whetstone's 1924 home), have single family dwellings. All of those homes are removed from Lot 20.

Moreover, Hendrickson Lane was constructed through at least Lots 15, 16 and 17, and runs immediately along the eastern boundary of Lot 20. Hendrickson Lane is a road between Hillen Road and Eudowood Lane, and it provides access for three (3) groups of townhomes. In fact, one of those townhome groups was constructed on part of Lot 19; a single family home was not constructed there. To permit a new access driveway onto Hendrickson Lane nearly at the corner with Hillen Road, negatively impacts the safety of drivers accustomed to using Hendrickson Lane to access the townhomes. Additionally, rows of townhomes also encompass many blocks directly

#### ADVERTISING REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FOR ZONING HEARINGS

The Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR) require that notice be given to the general public/ neighboring property owners relative to property which is the subject of an upcoming zoning hearing. For those petitions which require a public hearing, this notice is accomplished by posting a sign on the property (responsibility of the legal owner/petitioner) and placement of a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the County, both at least twenty (20) days before the hearing.\*

Zoning Review will ensure that the legal requirements for advertising are satisfied. However, the legal owner/petitioner is responsible for the costs associated with these requirements. 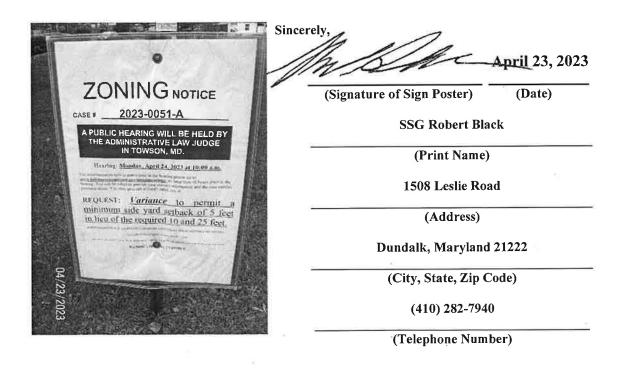

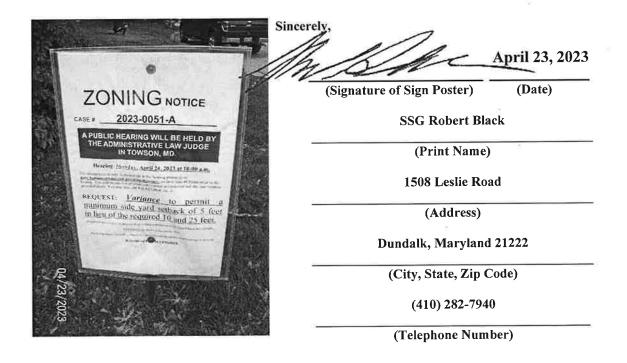

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for the following:

Variance - From Section 1B02.3.C.1 for a minimum side yard setback of 5' in lieu of the required 10' and 25'.

The subject site is currently a vacant lot in the Towson area. According to County GIS and the State Department of Assessments and Taxation website, the subject site is approximately 5,880 square feet. Surrounding uses include townhomes, the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church, and Stanley Black and Decker. The site is at the corner of Hillen Road and Hendrickson Lane. The stretch of Hillen Road across from the subject site is the rear of four groups of townhomes, all of which front East Susquehanna Avenue. Hendrickson Lane begins at Hillen Road, includes three groups of townhomes, and dead ends at the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church parking lot.

The subject site is within the boundaries of the Towson Community Plan, adopted February 3, 1992, and the Eastern Baltimore County Pedestrian and Bicycle Access Plan. Within the boundary of the Towson Community Plan (Plan), the site is within the East Towson Community Conservation Area; this is shown on Map 20, East Towson Vicinity Map. The Plan specifically calls out that the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church is an anchor for the community, and that expansion and renovation of the church is highly desirable to better serve the needs of the community (Towson Community Plan, pages 74-75). The Plan classifies the subject site as land to be acquired by the Mount Calvary African Methodist Episcopal Church for expansion (Towson Community Plan, pages 78-79). For vacant lots not designated as open space, church expansion, or community center expansion, the Plan emphasizes the importance of building affordable infill housing that is compatible with the existing surrounding housing in style, material, and siting (Towson Community Plan, page 87).

At this time, the Department of Planning cannot support the requested zoning relief for the following reasons:

1. Although the Towson Community Plan describes the importance of affordable infill housing, the proposed location is designated as church expansion.

2. The proposal for the subject site does not appear to be consistent with the immediate area, which is composed primarily of townhomes and some single family dwellings (Hillen Road at Eudowood Lane and Hillen Road at Linden Avenue) on larger lots of 47+ feet in width.

3. The proposed site layout does not appear to be consistent with the area. The submitted site plan shows a proposed driveway/parking pad in the front yard of the dwelling; a similar lot layout cannot be found in the area.

Although the Department of Planning acknowledges the narrow nature of the parcel, it is the Department's belief that the proposal is inconsistent with the character of the East Towson Community Conservation Area, and therefore would have an adverse impact on the community.

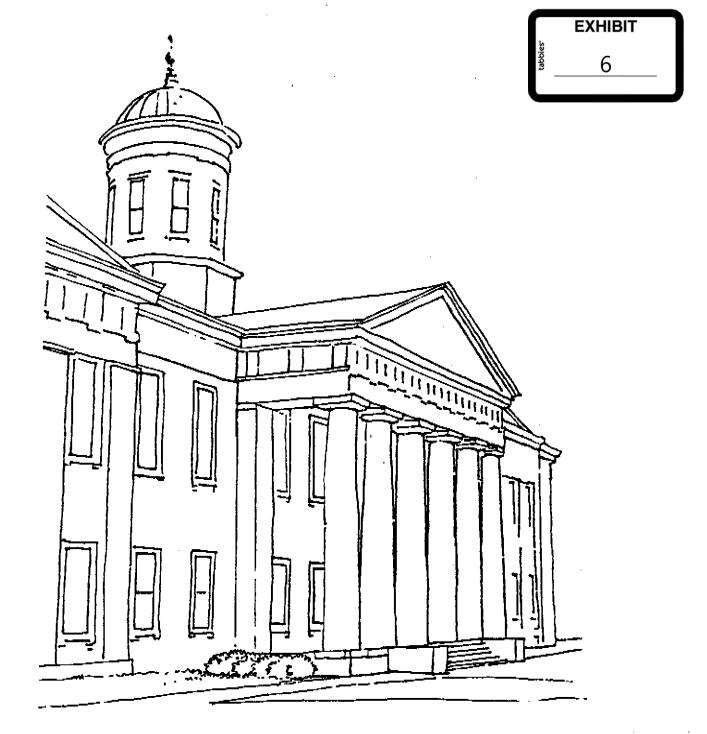

# TOWSON COMMUNITY PLAN

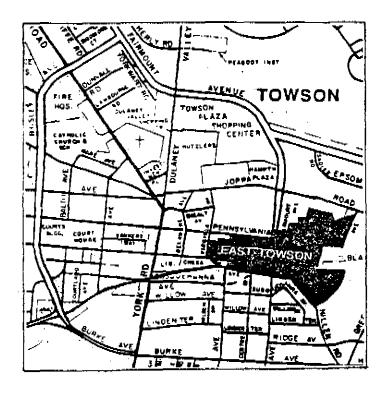
As Adopted By The Baltimore County Council on February 3, 1992

### INTRODUCTION

The residents of East Towson have expressed their hopes and desires to preserve and restore this historic African American Community. This document is a plan to remain the oldest existing community in Towson.

Today, East Towson is a quiet residential community with tree lined streets located on the eastern fringe of the Towson Town Center (See Map 1). It enjoys many advantages due to its proximity to the central business district, conversely this proximity has generated development pressures and traffic issues related to its location.

The original property owners were freed slaves who until 1830 had been in service at the Hampton Mansion. The East Towson community is the only remaining portion of the larger African American community that from 1830 to 1960 extended as far as the York Road and Bosley Avenue area, in an area known as "Sandy Bottom," and in North Towson and West Towson. The North and West Towson African American communities no longer exist. The newly reconstructed Mt. Olive Baptist Church and church owned duplex located on the Southwest corner of York and Bosley are the visible reminders that the York Road commercial corridor was once home to a large African American community.

#### I ACTION PLAN

The Baltimore County Master Plan 1989-2000 designated certain areas of the County as "enhancement areas." They were defined as "communities that have experienced a degree of physical decline and require County action to address specific problems such as poor condition of public facilities and private housing stock." (p.38)

Enhancement areas are located primarily in older areas of Baltimore County; some border commercial centers.

Action plans should be developed for these enhancement areas in order to stabilize these residential communities, and to continue to make them desirable places in which to live. They should have priority for the use of C.I.P. (Capital Improvement Program) funds for infrastructure improvements, open space acquisition, community services and facilities as well as for affordable housing. These improvements will foster civic involvement among the communities' current residents and may favorably influence prospective home buyers

### DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

The following chart indicates the population changes from 1970 - 1990 within the East Towson community (See Map 21). Residents report that the neighborhood population is aging.

### PROCESS

The East Towson African American Community has developed a community conservation plan for this enhancement area in order to achieve neighborhood stabilization, redevelopment of affordable infill housing and adequate buffers and protection from commercial encroachment of the Towson commercial core.

A community work group comprised of East Towson property owners and residents worked to develop an action plan for strengthening the residential community. Meetings were held often and were open to the public. Business owners and developers were invited to discuss development proposals as well as short and long-term plans, for sites near the community; the seven who participated by giving presentations and answering questions were:

#### A. LAND USE

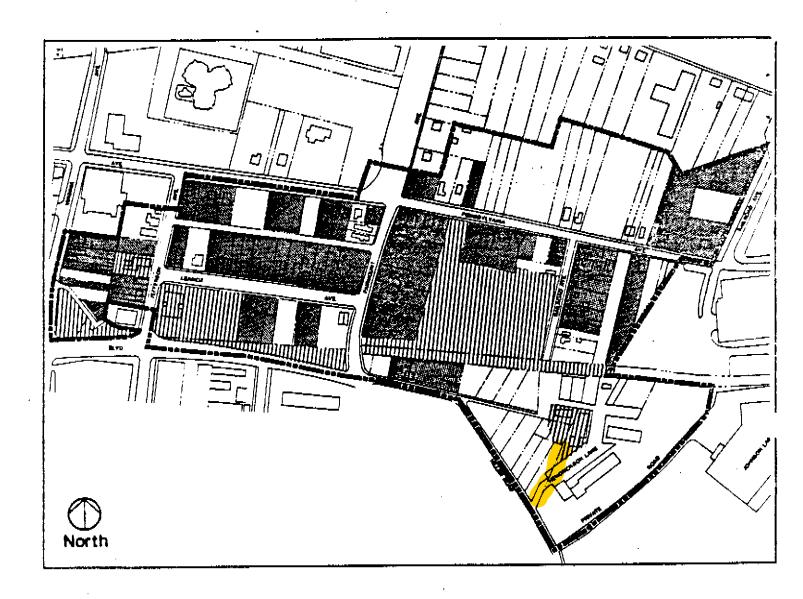
### 1. Existing Land use

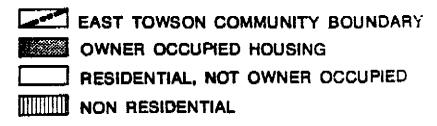
The East Towson community conservation plan comprises approximately 31 acres t with the predominant land use being single family and semi-detached dwellings and townhouses. Additional uses include the two churches, the St. James A.U.M.P. Church at 413 Jefferson Avenue and the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church at 300 Eudowood Lane and the Carver School at 300 Lennox Avenue. These institutional uses serve as anchors for this community. The Elks Lodge at 411 E. Pennsylvania Avenue is a fraternal organization that is an important social organization within the community.

Other non-residential land uses include the Baltimore Gas & Electric sub-station, Cambrill's Plumbing and Heating Contractor's office at 318 E. Pennsylvania Avenue and Technigraphics of Maryland at 398 Eudowood Lane.

### 2. Proposed Land Uses

Development of affordable housing on vacant parcels is the preferred use, since neighborhood stabilization is the primary objective of this Plan. The "transitional blocks" along the east side of Virginia Avenue and the south side of Pennsylvania should retain the RO zoning classification or be rezoned to ROA. The existing patterns of single family or semi-detached buildings should remain.





The Elks Lodge should remain at its present location on 411 E. Pennsylvania Avenue. Future plans to renovate or expand the Elks Lodge should be reviewed with the community prior to submittal to Baltimore County.

Expansion and renovation of the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church is highly desirable to better serve the needs of the community.

The Carver School should be renovated for use as a community/recreation center. A portion of the building is used for a Head Start program and meeting rooms and there is an existing outdoor recreation area. A structural assessment of the building is necessary to determine the feasibility of a full conversion.

The Baltimore Gas & Electric sub-station located in the area since 1952 should remain at its location on the south side of Pennsylvania Avenue and the west side of Railroad Avenue. The Baltimore Gas & Electric Company will work with both the community and the Office of Planning & Zoning to provide better landscaping/screening around the perimeter of the substation.

Technigraphics of Maryland, formerly Maryland Etching, may remain at its location on Eudowood Lane. Future expansion plans should be reviewed with the East Towson community prior to their submittal to Baltimore County. In the long term, this site should be considered for housing as illustrated on the design plan on Map 24.

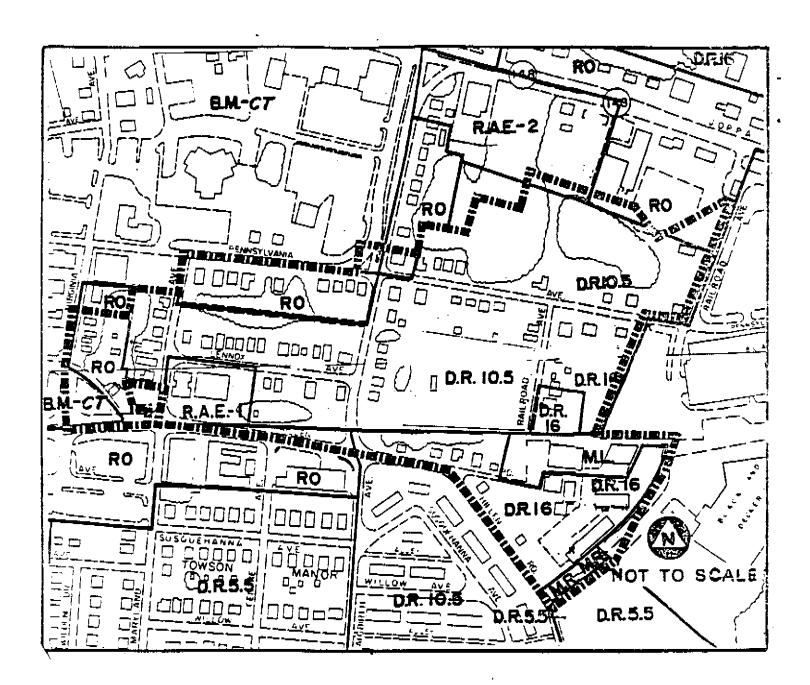
#### B. ZONING

### 1. Existing Zoning

The use and density allowed by the existing zoning designations do not protect and preserve the remaining residential community. Previous Towson plans assumed that the "loop road" would be widened and completed and that the property within "the loop" would be commercially redeveloped.

From 1971-1980, the houses on Virginia, Jefferson and Lennox Avenues were zoned BM-CT, Business Major with a Town-Center district. The remaining houses were zoned DR 16, a classification that is more appropriate for garden apartments or multi-family dwellings than for single family and semi-detached housing.

In 1980, the RO (Residential Office) zone was established which was intended to provide a transition between commercial and residential zones. The BM-CT designation was rezoned and RO put in place on the east side of Virginia



Avenue and on the south side of Pennsylvania between Jefferson and Fairmount and along Fairmount Avenue north of Pennsylvania Avenue. Most of the remaining residential community was rezoned from DR 16 to DR 10.5, a category more in keeping with lot sizes and densities. DR 16 was retained for the Hendrickson Lane Apartment sites as well as the Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church.

Generally, the RO zoned parcels have not been converted to office uses, but have remained residential. These homes form a significant part of the community. There is no effective transition from the Town Center to the residential community.

Since 1980, zoning patterns have remained essentially the same except in 1988 when the Carver School was rezoned from DR 10.5 to RAE 1 in an effort to redevelop the site with elderly housing.

The East Towson community plan area consists of the following zoning classifications: RO (Residential Office), DR 10.5, (10.5 dwelling units per acre), DR 16, (16 dwelling units per acre) and RAE 1, (40 dwelling units per acre) and ML, (Manufacturing Light). (See Map 22.)

The approximate acreage by zone is as follows:

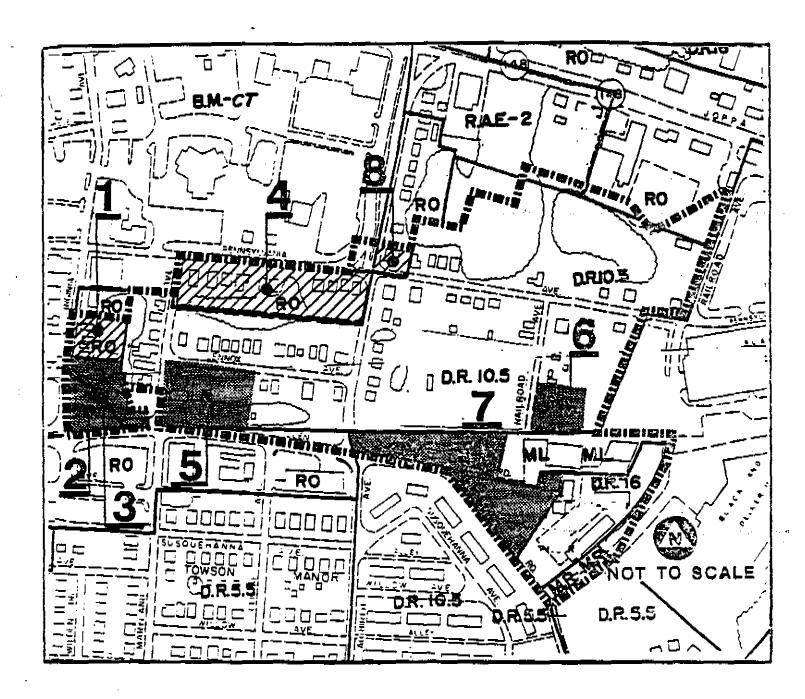

### 2. Proposed Zoning

The zoning should provide opportunities for infill housing, renovation/restoration of the Carver School for use as a community building, and the expansion of Mt. Calvary A.M.E. Church. Zoning should provide an effective transition from the town center to the residential community as well as stability for the residential community. Infill housing should be in accordance with design guidelines which will be developed in the Design portion of the plan.

The following zoning changes should occur through the 1992 Comprehensive Zoning process (See Map 23.)

Technigraphics of Maryland, formerly Maryland Etching Company, occupies the ML zoned property on Eudowood Lane. The ML zoning should remain in place for the present time. However, Baltimore County Economic Development Commission and the Office of Planning and Zoning should assist the printing company in relocating to a more suitable site outside the East Towson community. If this relocation occurs, rezoning the site to DR 10.5 is appropriate.

### C. ZONING REGULATIONS

### 1. Uses by Right in DR Zones

- A. Infill affordable housing is the preferred use within the plan area.
  - 1. Definition of Affordable Housing

Affordable Housing for the East Towson community is defined as housing affordable to households with income at or below 80 percent of the Baltimore area median income. For a family of four that this income limit would currently be \$34,800. Affordability would generally be determined through the proportion of monthly income required for housing, which should not exceed 30 to 35 percent. The 1991 income levels representing 80 percent of the Baltimore area median by household size are shown below:

The rent or sale price affordable to households with income at or below this level varies depending on the type of assistance provided. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) loans to a nonprofit developer may be applied to pre-development, land acquisition or construction costs to reduce housing costs. Buyers may also be assisted with CDBG funds for soft second mortgages or state funds which provide low-interest mortgage and/or settlement expense loans.

- B. The following uses will be permitted within the plan boundaries:
  - Dwellings, including, but not limited to, one-family detached houses, one-family semi-detached houses, one-family group houses, patio houses, side-and-back- attached houses, two-family houses, town-house apartment buildings (including group-house apartment buildings), garden apartment buildings, and other apartment buildings.

In the case of housing for the elderly and assisted living facilities of fewer than four, see Section 432. [Bill No. 36, 1988.]

- Local open space tracts or other common amenity open space.
- 3. Privately sponsored day care and nursery programs, as an ancillary use, within housing for the elderly projects, as defined in Section 101 of these regulations. [Bill No. 47, 1982.]
- Accessory uses or buildings other than those permitted by Special Exception
  - a. Swimming pools, tennis courts, garages, sheds
  - b. Family child care homes for up to eight children in accordance with Bill 7-91.
- 5. Group child care centers and nursery schools within
  - a. Churches
  - b. Community Buildings
  - c. School Buildings
  - d. Residences as a Special Exception
- C. Residential transition area (r.t.a.) definitions, uses and restrictions should remain in place in accordance with Section 1B01.1.B of the BCZR. However, r.t.a. standards may be relaxed for affordable infill housing by the County Review Group (CRG) or equivalent hearing officer. Section 1B01.1.B.I.c. exceptions to residential transition area may need to be amended.
  - A community input meeting must be held and the Compatibility/Design Review Process must occur prior to the granting of relief from r.t.a. standards.
