OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") as a Petition for Administrative Variance filed by the legal owners of the property, Lee Johnson Swartz and Peter Swartz ("Petitioners") for the property located at 4121 Sweet Air Road, Baldwin (the "Property"). The Petitioners are requesting Variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), Section 400.3, to approve an accessory building (garage) in the rear yard at a height of 22 ft. in lieu of the required 15 ft.

The Property is more fully depicted on the site plan which was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1. Street view photographs of the Property were provided. (Pet. Exs. 2A-2D). Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"), dated April 2, 2024, indicating development of the property must be in conformance with Ground Water Management Site Plan and Environmental Impact Review Requirements.

The Petitioners having filed a Petition for Administrative Variance and the Property having been posted on March 30, 2024 and there being no request for a public hearing, a decision shall be rendered based upon the documentation presented.

The Petitioners have filed the supporting affidavit as required by Section 32-3-303 of the Baltimore County Code ("BCC"). Based upon the information available, there is no evidence in the file to indicate that the requested variance would adversely affect the health, safety or general welfare of the public and should therefore be granted. The dwelling on the subject property, known as "Quinn" or "Sweet Air" has been on the Baltimore County Final Landmarks List since 1978. Approximately 3.17 acres of the original Quinn property remains which allows sufficient land for a small farming operation and for the restoration of the property's original gardens. The proposed barn will serve to house farming equipment to be used in conjunction with these purposes and will require additional height for the storage of larger machinery. Additionally, the additional height is being requested for the barn in an effort to keep the architectural style of the proposed structure in harmony with the roof pitch of the existing historical dwelling. In the opinion of the Administrative Law Judge, the information, photographs, and affidavits submitted provide sufficient facts that comply with the requirements of Section 307.1 of the BCZR. Furthermore, strict compliance with the BCZR would result in practical difficulty and/or unreasonable hardship upon the Petitioners.

Although the Department of Planning did not make any recommendations related to the detached garage, I will impose conditions that the detached garage shall not be converted into a dwelling unit or apartment, shall not contain any sleeping quarters, living area, kitchen or bathroom facilities, and will not have separate electric or utility connections, or used for commercial purposes.

Pursuant to the posting of the Property and the provisions of both the BCC and the BCZR, and for the reasons given above, the requested variance should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>18th</u> day of April, 2024, by the Administrative Law

Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance relief from the Baltimore County

Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), Section 400.3, to approve an accessory building (garage) in the

rear yard at a height of 22 ft. in lieu of the required 15 ft., and it is hereby, GRANTED; and

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

1. Petitioners may apply for their appropriate permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that

proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return, and be

responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.

2. Petitioners and subsequent owners shall not convert the detached garage into a dwelling unit or apartment. The detached garage shall not contain

any sleeping quarters, living area, bathroom facilities or kitchen facilities.

3. The detached garage shall not have a separate utility or electric

connection and shall connect all electrical to the home.

4. The detached garage shall not be used for commercial or industrial

purposes.

5. Petitioners shall comply with the DEPS ZAC comment, dated April 2,

2024; a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order

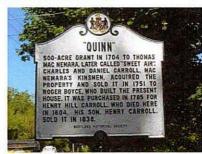

Affidavit in Support of Administrative Variance – 4121 Sweet Air Road, Baldwin, MD 21013 Facts Upon Which We Base the Request for an Administrative Variance

The property located at 4121 Sweet Air Road in Baldwin, MD 21013 is truly the definition of a unique, unusual and different property. The house called "Quinn" and also "Sweet Air" on the property was added to the Baltimore County Final Landmarks List on October 31, 1978 (Council Bill #101-78). Number sixteen on the Final Landmarks List, in the descriptive Landmarks Booklet, Quinn's description is: "Built in a lozengy pattern brick by Roger Boyce on land originally surveyed in 1704 for Thomas McNamara. Purchased in 1785 for Henry Hill Carroll by his trustee. House can be authenticated by tax list measurements and by an 18th Century sale advertisement. Disfigured during its life as an ordinary farm house and restored to Georgian purity c. 1938. [Placed on Final Landmarks List - 1978]." The home is also listed in the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties (BA-111) and is identified by a Maryland Historical Marker.

The Quinn farm, once 500 acres, was subdivided many times over the years. The historic house now resides on only 3.17 acres. Except for three older homes (built in 1900 and 1938) on lots to the south (behind our house) that were originally residences for the Quinn Farm workers, and an older home across Sweet Air Rd, built in 1872, the



houses around the property are newer homes. This historic home and property is subject to Baltimore County zoning laws that none of the surrounding properties are -TITLE 7. - HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL PRESERVATION.

As the current owners and caretakers of our 275-year-old, historically significant home, we strongly feel that it is our duty to preserve and protect its original structure, materials and style for future generations. At the same time, in order to survive, historic homes must continue to be relevant and useful through the years. Since our time as caretakers will only be for a small portion of Quinn's life, we can only try to make sure that it is an historically preserved home that also will meet the life needs of 21st century and hopefully beyond owners.

Though there are only 3.17 acres remaining of the "Quinn Farm" that is still enough land to allow for a small farming operation and for the once beautiful gardens to be restored, something that we are working on. Having a barn which would house equipment and supplies needed to care for the farm/yard and which, in the future might also be used as a garage on the property would add significant usefulness and value to the property. We believe that it could help ensure that Quinn remains a desirable property that future owners will continue to preserve and protect.

Due to the historical nature of the Quinn property, we have considered the design guidelines for the building of accessary structures on historic properties in planning for our barn. The applicable design guidelines for the building of accessary structures on historic properties don't specifically mention barns but state that 1) sheds.. should be of a size compatible with the principal structure, and 2) accessory structures should be constructed of materials compatible with the principle dwelling and incorporate some of its design characteristics. We also found guidance for accessary structures in BCZR§ 260.6. – Buildings, # 5 that says "Design accessory structures at a scale appropriate to the dwelling and design storage buildings and garages with the same architectural theme as the principal building on the site, providing consistency in materials, colors, roof pitch, and style."

There are no other properties similar to ours anywhere near us. Our home is approximately 40' tall, which is taller than zoning currently permits. The roof pitch is 12". To follow the historical guidance for accessory structures the roof pitch should also be 12", which would be impossible in a barn with height limited to 15'. An 11' foot tall barn would look out of place in comparison with our house. We are proposing to build a board and batten barn, which is the same as the barns that were historically on the property. The roof will have the same pitch and be made of the same materials as our house. The barn is designed in the English style which is one of the types of barns historically found in Maryland. Our hardship, the current owners, and likely any future owners is that there is no accessory building that can be used to house a tractor, farming or gardening equipment and supplies or (specific to us) a woodshop. My husband, a retired carpenter and serious woodworking hobbyist, has been using the small basement under the dining room of the main house as a woodshop, not an ideal situation. We plan to relocate the woodshop to the barn.

To address the fact that this hardship is not of our own creation, we show two old photos of the last large barn on the Quinn property which was torn down sometime between 2014 and 2016.

- 1. This photo was taken in 2013 by Google Maps from approximately the place where the driveway for 14109 Quinn Lane now, southeast of our Quinn house. In 2015 the lot for the 14109 property was sold by the previous owners of Quinn and in 2016 a new home at 14109 Quinn Lane was built. The large white barn is located partially on what is our property and partially what is the 14109 Quinn Lane property.
- 2. This photo, which was found in a 2014 MRIS listing of the Quinn property, shows that same barn just to the right of the existing shed. That shed has been approved for razing and will be the approximate location for our planned barn. The photo is taken facing east in our backyard.

In dividing up the Quinn property and tearing down the last remaining barn, the





previous owners left Quinn with only a 12x12 dilapidated shed for outdoor storage use.

Finally, while having a barn on the property would certainly be useful for us and for future owners, we believe that the "English style" barn we hope to build will be similar to the lost barns of the past and will also restore the "farm" character of the Quinn Farm.

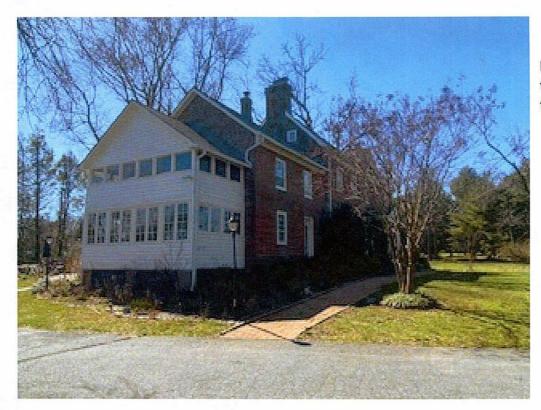

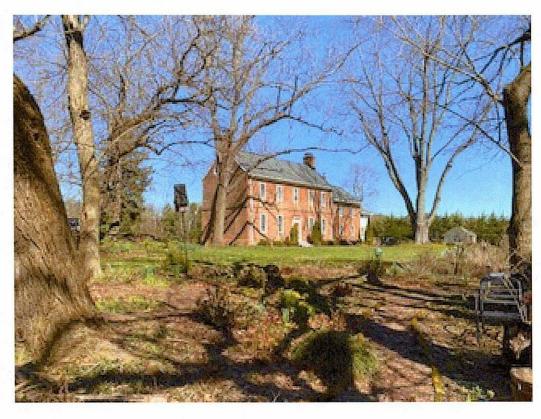

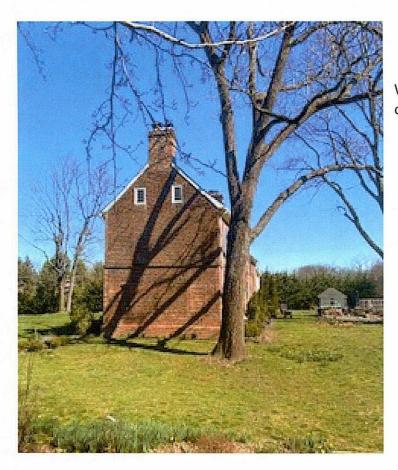
