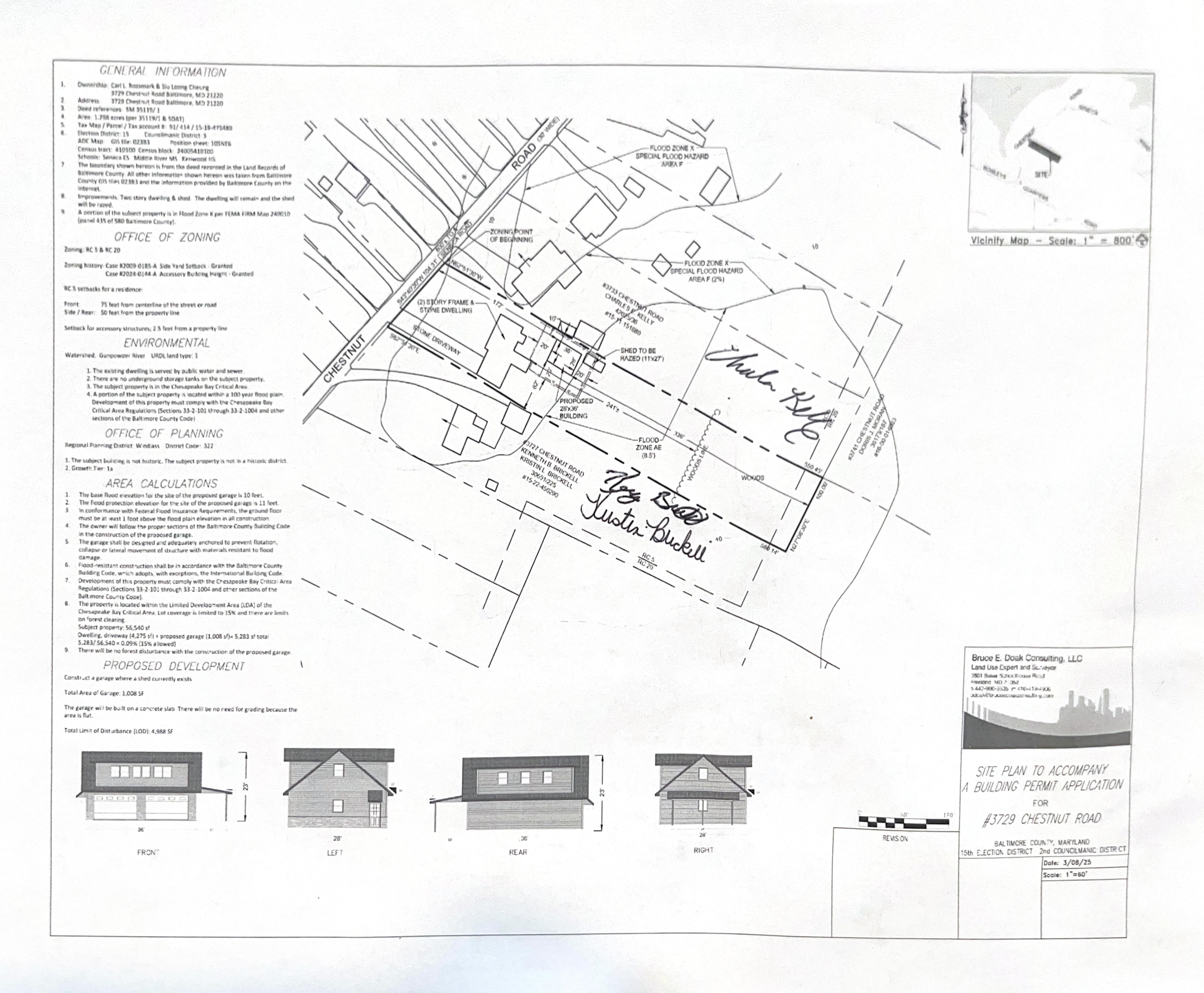

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") as a Petition for Variance filed by Carl Rossmark and Siu Loong Cheung Rossmark ("Petitioners") for the property located at 3729 Chestnut Road, Middle River, Baltimore County, Maryland (the "Property"). The Petitioners are requesting variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") § 400.3 to permit an accessory building (garage) with a height of 23 ft. in lieu of the maximum permitted height of 15 ft.

A public WebEx hearing was conducted on July 11, 2024, using the virtual hearing platform WebEx in lieu of an in-person hearing. The Petition was properly advertised and posted. The Petitioners appeared at the hearing in support of the Petition. Bruce E. Doak of Bruce E. Doak Consulting, LLC, a licensed surveyor, prepared the Site Plan ("Site Plan"). Mark Goloboski, a nearby resident and commercial property owner in close proximity to the Property, appeared and provided testimony in opposition to the Petition.

The following exhibits were submitted by Petitioner and admitted into the record: (1) Site Plan; (2) SDAT Report; (3) Subdivision plat; (4) GIS; (5) GIS photograph; (6) Key Sheet and photographs A-J; (7) Architectural elevations and floor plans A-C; (8) Letters of Support; and (9) Flood information. The following reports were submitted by county agencies and were admitted

into the record: (1) Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments from the Department of Planning ("DOP"); (2) Department of Environmental Protection & Sustainability ("DEPS") comments; and (3) Development Plans Review ("DPR") comments. DPR on behalf of DPW-T noted that the property is located within the Tidal Special flood Hazard Area Zone and recommended denial of the requested relief. Other agency comments do not indicate any objections.

Findings of Fact

The Property is an approximately 1.3-acre parcel located near but not adjacent to Seneca Creek in the Middle River area of Baltimore County. The majority of the parcel is zoned RC-5 with a small portion zoned RC-20 and is improved with a single-family dwelling with 1,767 sq. ft. of above-grade living area. See Petitioners' Exhibit 2. The Property is located within the Limited Development Area (LDA) of the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area (CBCA) and is subject to the RC-5 performance standards. The Property is also improved with a small accessory structure (shed) located in the rear of the property. The rear of the lot is heavily forested with all adjacent lots similarly enjoying dense forest cover. The property received prior zoning relief in 2009 for an addition to the single-family home to accommodate an attached garage. See OAH Case No. 2009-0185-A.

Petitioners propose to raze the existing shed and construct a two-story garage of approximately 1,008 sq. ft. in its place. Mr. Doak stated that the garage is the minimum size necessary to accomplish the Rossmark's purpose for household and yard storage. The garage will be used for storage of lawn mowers, a boat, and other similar residential items on the first floor and the second floor will be used for storage and general accessory use to the single-family dwelling. See Petitioners' Exhibit 7 for architectural elevations and floor plan. Mr. Doak stated

that the garage will be served by electric but not water or septic and will not be used for commercial purposes. The proposed height of the garage is 23 ft. which exceeds the maximum height permitted for an accessory structure of 15 ft. pursuant to BCZR § 400.3 necessitating the request for a height variance. No driveways are proposed to the garage. Mr. Doak explained that the additional height was needed to minimize the footprint of the garage and to limit further impervious surface on the lot located in the LDA of the CBCA.

In addressing DPR/DPW-T's comments, Mr. Doak countered that while a portion of the property is located within the floodplain the proposed shed will not encroach into that floodplain. Mr. Doak submitted GIS mapping from both Baltimore County and FEMA showing the boundaries of the Tidal Special Flood Hazard Area Zone. See Petitioners' Exhibit 9. Further, the proposed accessory structure is located at an elevation of 10 ft. whereas the floodplain sits at 8.5 ft. (with the single-family dwelling sitting at an elevation of 12 ft.). Id. Based upon this evidence, Mr. Doak concluded that the proposed garage will not be located within the floodplain and would not trigger floodplain regulations impacting the proposed accessor structure. Mr. Doak indicated that grading could raise the elevation of the accessory structure if additional elevation were needed to comply with floodplain regulations. Mr. Doak further testified that the accessory structure would not impede any neighboring property's light or viewshed, will not be visible from any public road, and will have no other adverse impacts on adjacent properties or the community. Letters of support from each adjacent property owner were received and admitted as Petitioners' Exhibit 8A and 8B.

The single-family dwelling was built in 1969 and was Mr. Rossmark's childhood home. Mr. Rossmark testified that many other neighbors have similarly sized two-story garages and the property has not accumulated standing water or suffered flooding conditions during prior major flooding events in recent years. Mr. Rossmark further stated the purpose of the accessory structure

was for storage of yard maintenance equipment like lawn mowers with the second floor for other household storage and use. Mrs. Rossmark testified on the need for additional storage for their 1.5 story 1,767 sq. ft. single-family home. Ms. Rossmark characterized the second-floor as "my own space" and that it would not be used as living quarters.

Mark Goloboski, a nearby resident and commercial property owner in close proximity to the Property, testified in opposition. Mr. Goloboski challenged the accuracy of Mr. Doak's floodplain elevation calculations, asserting that the garage may in fact be located in the floodplain or other protected area. Mr. Doak confirmed that elevations were used from current Baltimore County GIS mapping and not from survey elevations calculated on-site. Mr. Doak further countered that the property itself was not located within the floodplain regardless of the purported elevations. See Petitioner's Exhibit 9. Given the location of Mr. Goloboski's properties, when asked how the proposed garage with a height of 23 ft. might impact him or his properties, Mr. Goloboski stated that they would not directly impact his properties but that if the garage were sited in an area of the property where it should not be located, "it would be against the law." Mr. Goloboski failed to articulate how he would be impacted by this Petition and this ALJ cannot discern from the record any direct impacts to Mr. Goloboski's property as Mr. Goloboski's residential and commercial properties are not adjacent to or within eyesight of the property.

Conclusions of Law

Petitioners are requesting variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") § 400.3 to permit an accessory building (garage) with a height of 23 ft., in lieu of the maximum height of 15 ft. Pursuant to BCZR § 307.1, "...the [Administrative Law Judge] shall have ...the power to grant variances from height and area regulations, from off-street parking regulations, and from sign regulations only in cases where special circumstances or conditions

exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship...Furthermore, any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said height, area, off-street parking or sign regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to public health, safety and general welfare..." A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

I find that the Property is unique because it is located within the LDA of the CBCA and the rear of the lot is located within the floodplain. These conditions limit impervious surface on the lot and restrict the types of improvements permitted on-site. Further, the rear of the lot is a heavily forested buffer and no tree removal is proposed under this application, limiting the buildable area and location. Mr. Doak credibly testified these conditions often cause accessory structures to "rise up instead of out" and limit the buildable space on this as to not encroach into floodplain. Further, the new garage will occupy a portion of the yard currently improved by the existing shed and the rear half of the yard will remain undisturbed under substantial forest cover. For these reasons, I find that special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to this parcel and the existing improvements on the site and strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty. I also find that the requested variance relief can be granted in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR and without injury to the health, safety or general welfare. Photographs of the property and existing shed

indicate the presence of substantial vegetative buffers with spacious yards. See Petitioners' Exhibits 6a-6l. There is no credible evidence in this record to indicate that the height variance would have any adverse impacts on the health, safety, or general welfare of adjacent property owners or others in the community. On the contrary, the Petition received support from the abutting neighboring property owners most impacted by the proposed accessory structure. See Petitioners' Exhibit 8.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>23rd</u> day of **July 2024**, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance pursuant to BCZR, §400.3 to permit an accessory building (garage) with a height of 23 ft., in lieu of the maximum height of 15 ft. be, and it is hereby, **GRANTED**.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

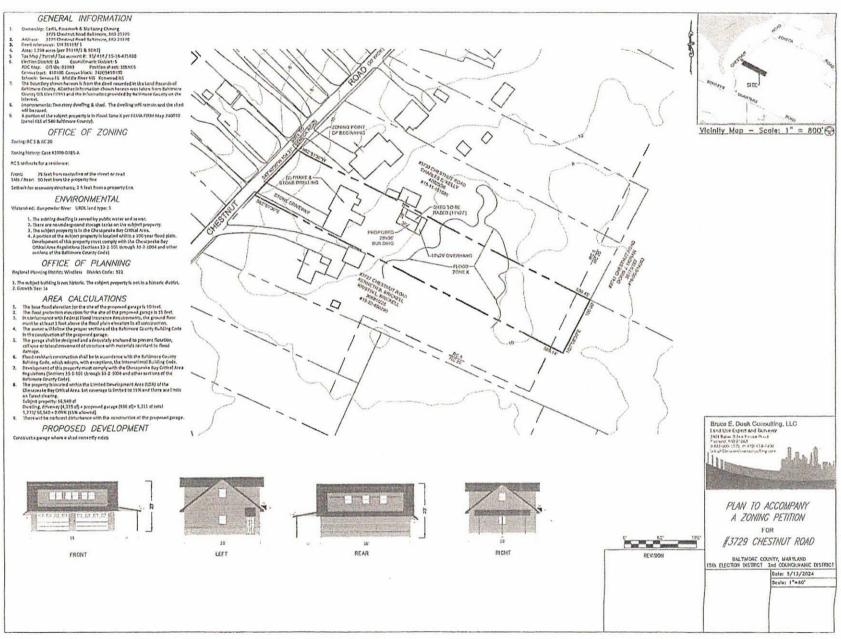
- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time and appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition;
- 2. Petitioners and subsequent owners shall not convert the detached accessory building (garage) into a dwelling unit or apartment. The detached garage shall not contain any sleeping quarters, living area, bathroom facilities or kitchen facilities:
- 3. The accessory building (garage) shall not have a separate utility or electric connection and shall connect all electrical to the home; and
- 4. The accessory building (garage) shall not be used for commercial or industrial purposes. The storage of commercial supplies or materials is strictly prohibited;
- 5. The Site Plan (Pet. Ex. 1), a copy of which is attached hereto, is incorporated herein in its entirety.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

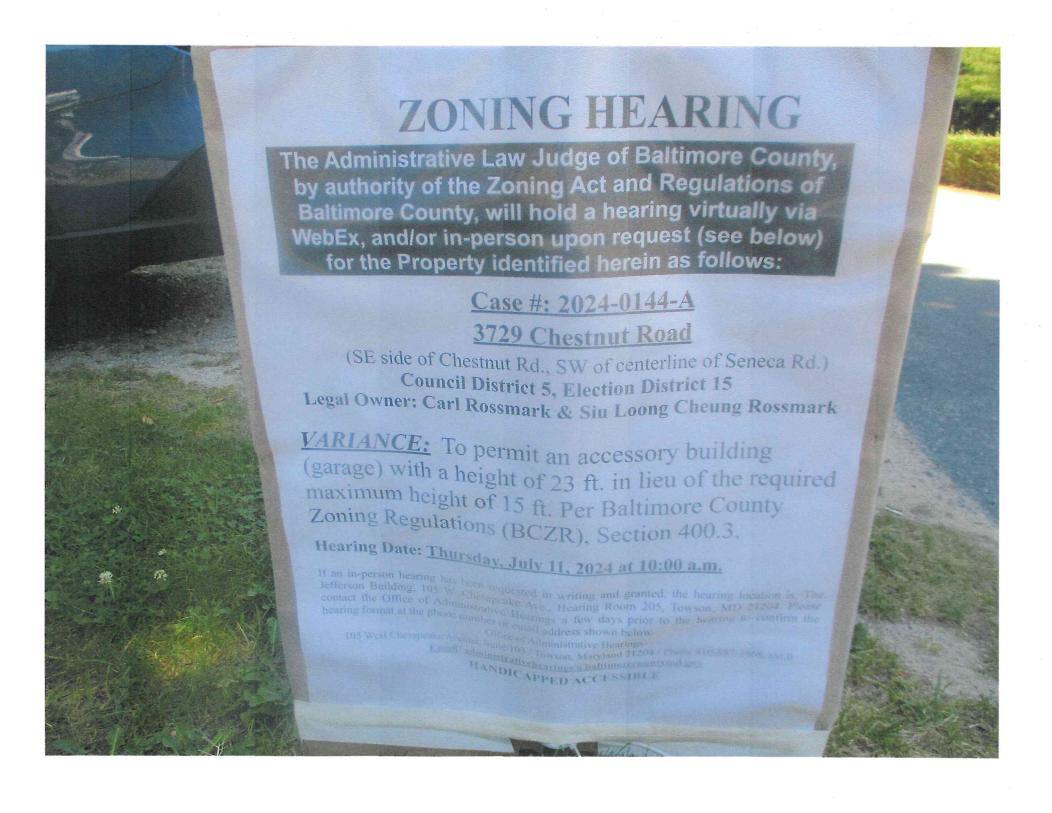

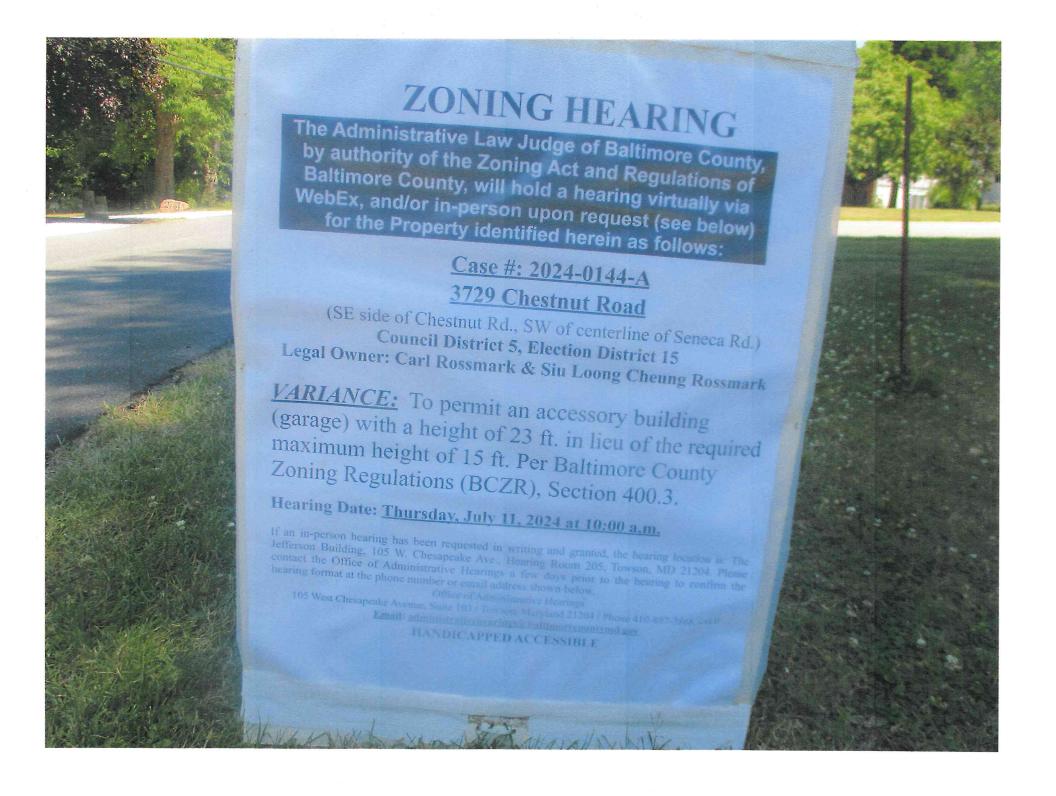

EPS has reviewed the subject zoning petition for compliance with the goals of the Statemandated Critical Area Law listed in the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, Section 500.14. Based upon this review, we offer the following comments:

1. Minimize adverse impacts on water quality that result from pollutants that are discharged from structures or conveyances or that have run off from surrounding lands;

The subject property is located within a Limited Development Area (LDA) and is subject to Critical Area requirements. The applicant is seeking approval to permit an accessory building with a height of 23 feet in lieu of the required maximum height of 15 feet per Section 400.3 BCZR. The proposed development must meet LDA requirements and the 15% afforestation requirement. According to the zoning property description, the property is 1.298 acres. Based on this square-footage, the maximum lot coverage for this property is 8,481 square feet or 15%. If the proposed development can comply with the lot coverage restrictions and the 15% afforestation requirement, the relief requested can result in minimal adverse impacts to water quality.

2. Conserve fish, plant, and wildlife habitat;

This is a non-waterfront property. The property consists of a house, driveway and shed with a front lawn. There is a lawn area and forest in the rear of the property.

Based on GIS, there are hydric soils within the forest on the property which may indicate the presence of non-tidal wetlands onsite. There is a 25-foot Critical Area buffer associated with non-tidal wetlands. Meeting the lot coverage, Critical Area buffer, forest clearing, and the 15% afforestation requirements will aid in the conservation of fish, plant, and wildlife habitat in the watershed.

3. Be consistent with established land use policies for development in the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area, which accommodate growth and also address the fact that, even if pollution is controlled, the number, movement and activities of persons in that area can create adverse environmental impacts.

If the proposed development can be designed to meet the lot coverage, Critical Area buffer, forest clearing, and afforestation requirements, the relief requested will be consistent with established land-use policies.

The Bureau of Development Plans Review has reviewed the subject zoning items and we have the following comments.

DPR: Proposed work is in100-year floodplain BC AE Zone BF 8.5 NAVD88

DPW-T: A) The property is within the Tidal Special Flood Hazard Area Zone AE (BFE=8.5) per panel FIRM 2400100435F dated 9/26/08. Must comply with Flood Plain Ordinance, See County Bill 6-24, 40-15 (the latest edition of the Baltimore County Code) and Bill 42-15, and Section 32-4-414 of Article 32, Title 4 of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as amended. The LiMWA is not on the property.

B) The proposed accessory structure is equal to 1008 square feet. Code 32-8-507 (A) limits accessory structures in a tidal special flood hazard area to 300 square feet. For this reason, the administrative variance must be denied.

Landscaping: No comment.

Recreations & Parks: No Greenways affected.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for the following:

Variance – To permit an accessory building (garage) with a height of 23' in lieu of the maximum permitted 15' per Baltimore County Zoning Regulations Section 400.3.

The subject site is an approximately 1.3 acre parcel near Seneca Creek in the Middle River area. It is improved with a frame and stone dwelling and an 11' x 27' shed. Per the site plan submitted with the petition, the Petitioner wishes to raze the existing shed and construct a larger garage in its place. The new garage is proposed to be 28' x 36'.

The subject site is primarily zoned RC 5, with a small portion of RC 20 at the rear, and is located outside the Urban-Rural Demarcation Line (URDL). The garage is proposed within the RC 5 zoned portion of the site. Performance Standards for the RC 5 zone are outlined in Section 1A04.4 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. The Standards call for accessory structures to be designed at a scale appropriate to the dwelling; garages designed with the same architectural theme as the principal building on the site, providing consistency in materials, colors, roof pitch, and style; ensuring that exteriors of all buildings use the same finish materials and architectural details on all front, side and rear elevations; using quality material such as brick, stone or cedar is encouraged; and that garages not become the dominant street feature, with garage doors using items such as windows, decorative patterns, and color to relieve the visual impact.

The subject site is within the boundary of the Bowley's Quarters Community Action Plans of 1992 and 2000. The Bowley's Quarters Action Plan 200, adopted February 20th, 2001, provides background information, community objectives, land use analysis, and information on environmental issues, adequate facilities, and design guidelines related to new dwelling construction within the plan area boundary. The Plan does not provide insight on construction of new accessory structures.

The Department of Planning contacted the representative for the petition via email on June 11th, 2024 seeking additional information on if a driveway would be constructed to access the proposed garage and why the increased height was necessary. In a June 18th reply, the representative explained that the

proposed height is to accommodate a second story for the garage; the first floor is proposed to be yard equipment storage and possible boat storage, and the second floor is proposed to be additional storage and a family crafting area. No driveway is proposed from the road to the detached garage.

The Department of Planning has no objections to the requested relief, subject to the following condition:

1. The proposed accessory structure is subject to the RC 5 Performance Standards outlined in Section 1A04.4 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

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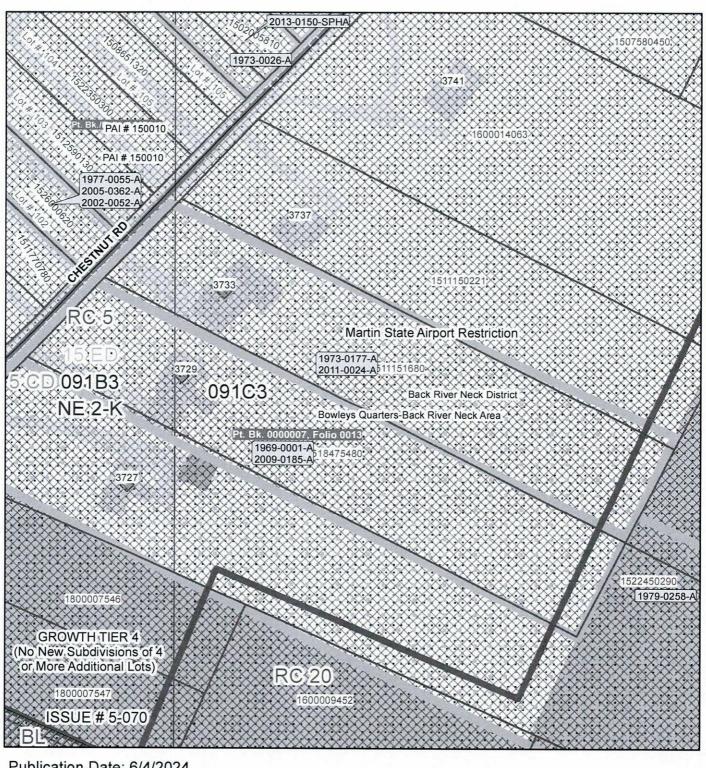
