

Questions and Responses

- 1. Will an engineer's trailer be required? If yes, what are the requirements?
 - a. Yes, a jobsite trailer is required to be onsite during the length of the project for biweekly progress meetings. Minimum requirements are that it is conditioned and it should be able to hold a table for 5-7 people.
- 2. Will the entire park be closed during construction?
 - a. The park will remain open during construction. The expectation is that the garden will not be used until mid-March by constituents. Public access to part of the parking lot, pavilion, and playground will need to be maintained. The comfort station will need to be available with the understanding that it may need to be temporarily closed when work in the immediate vicinity is being performed.
- 3. Are there any permits the Contractor will be required to apply for?
 - a. Baltimore County obtained SWM and Grading permits—the contractor is to obtain any required trade permits.
- 4. Are there CAD files available? If not, are there vector PDF's available? The current set appears to have scanned in pages which can affect scale and make it difficult to run earthwork.
 - a. CAD files are available and can be provided upon request, as can vector PDFs. The scanned in pages are mylars and can be substituted with PDFs for ease of legibility. - 5. What is the section/thickness of the existing asphalt pavement scheduled for demolition?
 - a. According to the geotechnical report, the section/thickness of the existing asphalt pavement scheduled for demolition in the **courts area** ranges from 4"-5" thick. Borings were not taken in the existing asphalt walks; however, if the asphalt was poured according to Baltimore County standard details (Plates R-1 and R-2A), it should be $\sim 3"-4.5"$ thick.
- 6. What is the section/thickness of the existing concrete pavement scheduled for demolition?
 - a. Borings were not taken in the existing concrete pavement; however, if the pavement was poured according to Baltimore County standard details (Plate R-19), it should be ~4" thick.

- 7. What is the size of the existing water service to be tapped?
 - a. The survey did not pick up the size of the existing water service to be tapped, therefore the contractor will have to test pit to confirm its size.
- 8. Detail 4 on Sheet L5.03 calls for an embedded grate frame and concrete drain body. Please confirm this detail is irrelevant and Contractor shall follow storm drain cleanout detail and grate details on Sheet C-402 per Note 3 on Sheet L5.03.
 - a. Detail 4 on sheet L5.03 was shown for design intent only and the contractor shall follow the storm drain cleanout and grate details on C-402.
